Coffee People serves up variety

This coffee shop offers both coffee and non-coffee beverages as well as several food items

On campus, there is certainly no shortage of places that serve coffee beverages. When all the places on 13th Avenue are included, it seems as if coffee is available every two feet around here.

With so many choices available, coffee sellers rely on selection and atmosphere to differentiate themselves. Some cater to those who want to grab a quick drink, while others offer a more relaxed, sit-down environment.

Coffee People is the latter type of coffee merchant. Coffee People has grown into a fairly large chain, yet it fits into a unique niche that distinguishes it from the multitudes of other coffee joints.

The difference is choice. Coffee People offers an enormous menu that includes a variety of espresso drinks, plain coffees, shakes, juices and teas. There is something for everyone — even for those who don't like coffee.

Coffee People offers a wide array of non-coffee alternatives. If you order tea at most coffee places, you get a sad little cup of water and the same kind of tea bags they have in the dorm cafeterias. At Coffee People, however, you can choose from a variety of flavors that range from the exotic to the traditional. Flavors like Madagascar Vanilla, Temple of Heaven, Tropicana and Traditional Earl Grey are freshly steeped, making for a much better flavor than bag teas.

Other coffee alternatives include shakes and fresh-squeezed orange and apple juices. Coffee People also serves more than just biscotti to go with your drinks. A variety of cookies, bagels, muffins, brownies and other treats are available.

Bulk coffees and teas are available to take home in 1/4, 1/2 and 1-pound amounts. Whatever your coffee or non-coffee favorite may be, Coffee People is likely to have just what you want.

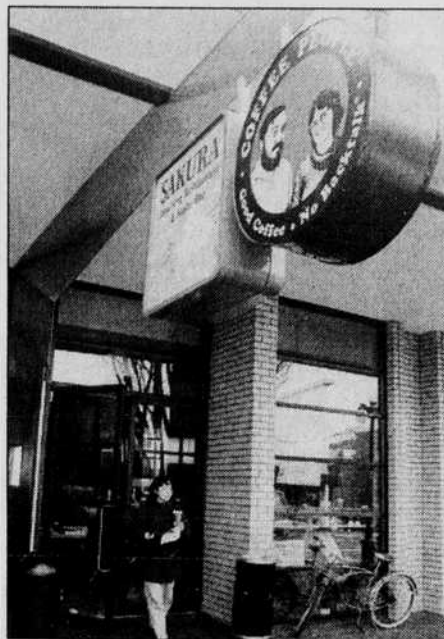
