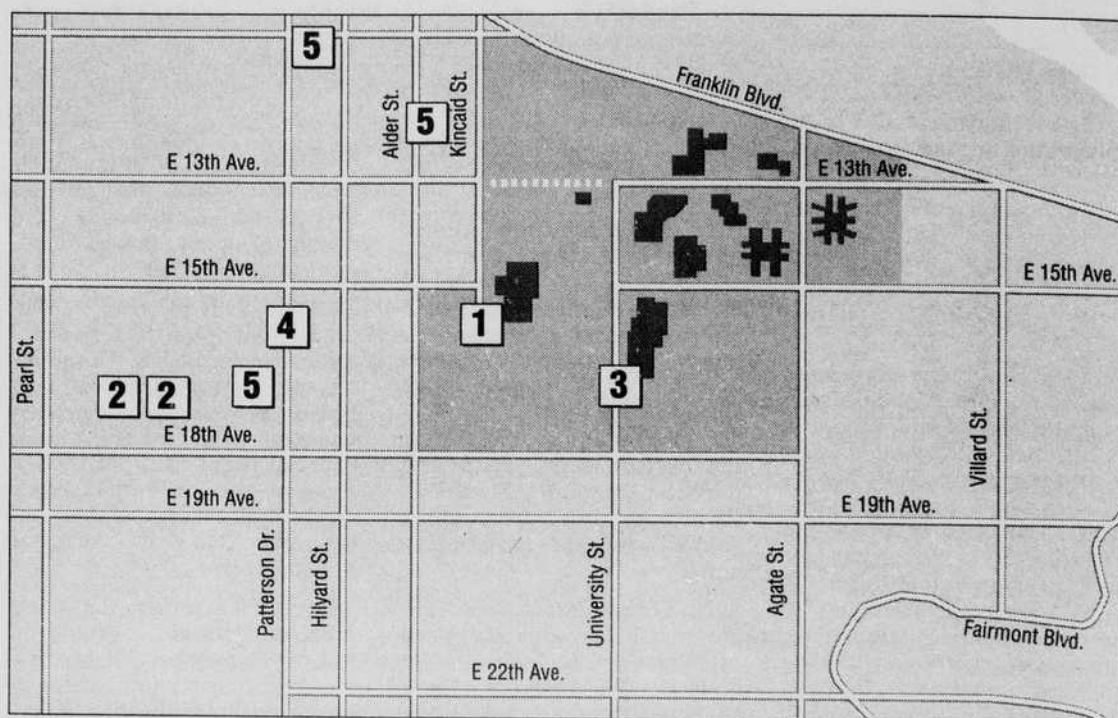

POLICE BEAT

Police lack leads

1 A student issued a complaint to OPS regarding an individual exposing himself outside a window at the Knight Library Tuesday, Jan. 28. The student, who was studying near a window in the library, told OPS that a white male of medium build approached the window she was sitting near and exposed himself. Officers couldn't find anyone matching the description she gave and have no leads at this time.

Police bust parties

2 Distributor-supplied keg receipts alerted Eugene Police officers to a party on E. 16th Avenue. They arrived about 12:15 a.m., Feb. 1, and estimated 50-75 people were drinking and partying in the outside yard of an apartment building. Upon arriving officers learned that the hosts were selling cups to get beer for \$3.00 each. One University student was charged with selling alcohol without a license.

A second party took place on 16th Avenue and Ferry Street. Officers had issued a warning earlier

in the night to let the host know that they would be in the area. When they arrived at approximately 2:00 a.m. Sat., Feb. 1, there was loud music coming from the party and broken bottles in the street in front of the house. While the officers were trying to locate the host of the party and question her, an individual attempted to interfere with the officers' efforts. After explaining to this person that he was interfering with police business and still getting no cooperation, the individual was charged with Interfering with a Police Investigation. The host was also charged with prohibited noise.

Student punches glass

3 A University student was charged with Criminal Mischief II on Saturday, Feb. 1, during the men's basketball game. Officers said that the individual was kicked out of the game when he would not refrain from moving out onto the floor and yelling obscenities at the opposing team. On his way out of McArthur Court, he yelled some profanity at the security guard working at the

door and punched the door window, breaking it.

Bicycle missing

4 A bike was stolen from E. 15th Avenue and Patterson Street on Jan. 26, sometime between 10 p.m. and 8 a.m. The owner left the bike leaning against his apartment building overnight and the next morning it was gone. He heard nothing suspicious overnight. EPD is classifying it as Theft II.

Several meters stolen

5 Several parking meters were stolen over about a nine-day period from a number of different streets in Eugene. The first was stolen from the 100 block of E. 16th Avenue on Jan. 18, at an unknown time. Then on Jan. 26, two more were stolen from 1100 Alder St., again the time is unknown. The last two were stolen from the 600 block of E. 11th Avenue. Police have no leads at this time and would appreciate any information people have.
