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PFC advocates student program growth

ASUO-funded groups

The Programs Finance Committee (PFC) awarded three increases for ASUO funded programs Tuesday.

The Jewish Student Union (JSU) received \$10,258 dollars for their 1997-98 budget. The PFC allocated the 16.5 percent increase to fund numerous programs on JSU's agenda for next year. The group requested nearly three thousand dollars more than what the PFC awarded them.

The JSU asked the PFC to recognize them on the same financial level as the "big four" ethnic student unions — BSU, NASU, APA-SU and MEChA. "One step to recognition is getting a budget that is in step with the other ethnic student unions," said Micah Citrin, JSU director.

JSU plans to use the bigger budget to offer educational programs for students. The group plans to offer introductory seminars to help students entering the new Jewish Studies ma-

For. Another educational program they have planned is the coffee talk series where a professor discusses current issues with students. They also plan to show educational videos. A Hebrew instructional manual and software along with a reference library are planned for next year. There other projects include Jewish week, and the Shoah week for the Holocaust Week when there will be something going on every day of the week.

The Mediation Program, which handles students disputes requested a 17 percent increase of \$41,486. The group was awarded \$35,447, a .001 percent increase for next year. The group requested the increase to pay for the retirement fund for the current director Jacque Gibson.

The PFC voted to send the group to the Stu-

dent Senate and eventually to President Frohnmayer to fund Gibson's insurance plan with over-realized student incidental fees. The PFC said it supports Gibson's request, but wanted to have the money be awarded from the administration. The PFC said that if they funded Gibson's benefits then her benefits would need to be voted on by the PFC for the next seven years.

The PFC awarded the Model United Nations the amount that they requested. The group asked for \$420 for there 1997-98 budget. The request was a 40% increase from last year's budget.

The group plans to use the money for traveling expenses to attend the Model United Nations conference in San Francisco this year. They plan to take all nine of there members to the conference. They will also be speaking with high school students about the University's Model United Nations as a recruitment effort.

The Model UN group simulates the United Nations by researching issues from another country's point of view, then they debate the issues and try to pass bills. The passed bills are then sent to the real UN.
