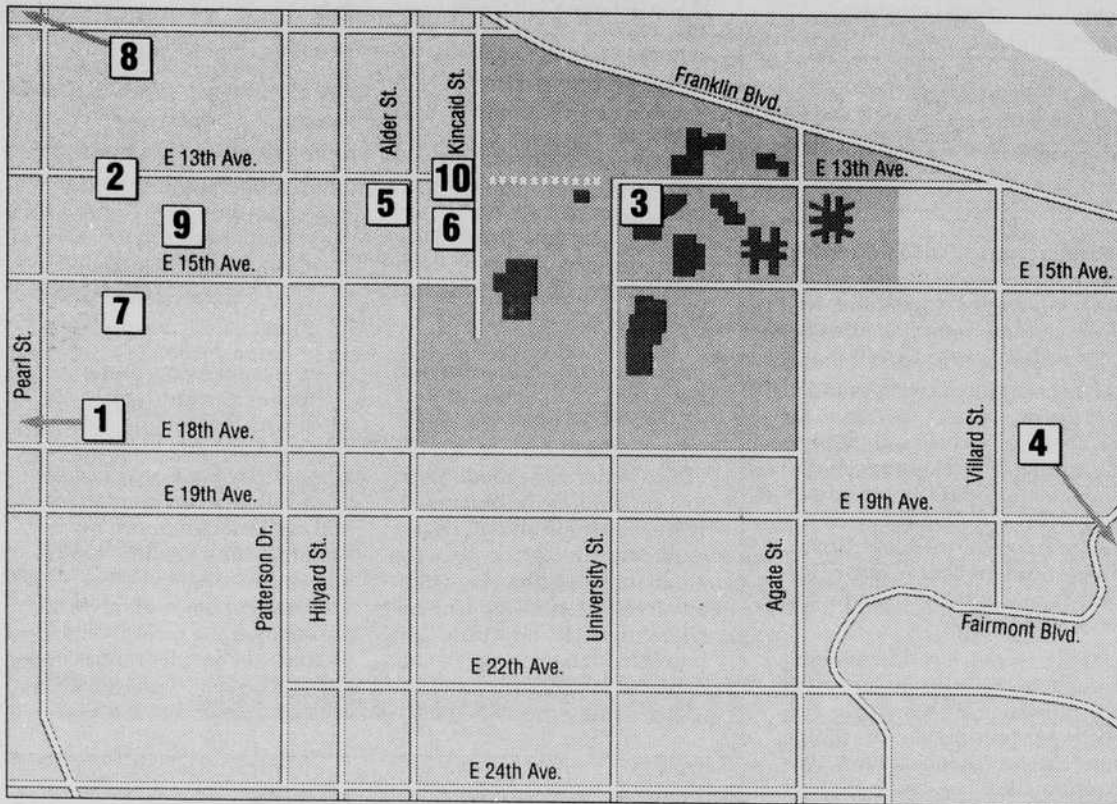

POLICE BEAT

Dari Mart robbed

1 After a male suspect entered Dari Mart on 1735 W. 18th Ave. on Feb. 16, he demanded and received an unknown amount of money and left the store at about 1 p.m. The suspect led the clerk to believe that he had a weapon, but the clerk told police that he never actually saw one.

The clerk was not injured, and no vehicle was seen. The suspect was described as a white male, about 30 years old, 5'10" and 150 lbs., with shoulder-length blond hair. Eugene police have no leads at this time.

Drugs caused shooting

2 Police have learned more about the shooting that occurred Saturday evening, said Sgt. Poppe of the Eugene police department.

"We have reports that the suspect involved in the armed robbery was involved in a drug transaction just prior to the shooting," Poppe said.

He also said shootings on 13th Avenue and Mill Street are becoming "common in the area."

Police don't know the specifics about the drug transaction that occurred, but they reported that an investigation into the circumstances is continuing.

EMU machine stolen

3 A long-distance calling card machine was torn from the wall of the EMU between 1 p.m. Feb. 12 and 10 a.m. Feb. 13. Police reports said the contents, about \$600-\$700 in calling cards, were removed from the machine, which was found discarded near

Hayward Field.

The police have no leads at this time, but an investigation is underway.

Minors found in park

4 According to police reports, two University students were approached at Hendricks Park on Feb. 15 at about 1:45 a.m. because they were violating park regulations. One student displayed a fraudulent Oregon State drivers' license and had alcohol in his possession. He was charged with forgery and minor in possession (MIP).

5 A 19-year-old University student was also charged with MIP when she was taken from a house on Alder Street by medics to receive treatment for excessive alcohol consumption.

Shoplifter caught

6 When a University student attempted to leave the University Bookstore with food items she didn't pay for on Feb. 14 at about 2 p.m., she was charged with shoplifting. The total value of the products was \$6.94.

Suspect leaves scene

7 When officers approached three people who were, according to police reports, "acting suspiciously" on Mill Street at about 5 p.m. on Feb. 16, one of them fled the scene on a bike.

Neither of the other two could identify the one that fled. Police found pieces of paper on one transient that he admitted were LSD.

The suspect was charged with unlawful possession of a con-

trolled substance.

Members assaulted

8 Members of the Wolf Creek Job Corps from Roseburg were involved in an assault at the Eugene Motor Lodge on Feb. 15 at 12:53 a.m.

Two members of the job corps were in their hotel room when previous members broke into the room and began punching and assaulting a female member.

One of the individuals who entered the hotel room had a semi-automatic handgun, a witness told police.

LSD found on suspect

9 A 19-year-old Eugene resident was charged with unlawful possession of a controlled substance on Feb. 10 at about 9:30 p.m. on E. 15th Avenue and Ferry Street.

Officers from the Eugene police department found LSD in his possession. The suspect told police the drug was given to him by a male in the EMU.

Cosmetics shoplifted

10 Another shoplifting charge was made at the University Bookstore when a student tried to leave with some cosmetic items at 10:55 a.m. on Feb. 14. The total value of the products was \$19.75.

Campus bikes stolen

11 There were eight campus bike thefts reported to OPS in the last week. The value of the bikes in total was about \$3,430. Poppe estimates that the average value of the bikes stolen is \$400.
