In addition to what they promised in their platform, Scotten and Banfield were also able to implement a book swap, which will take place for the first time this year. Also, Scotten and Projects Coordinator Wylie Chen have been working on an amphitheater proposal for the EMU Courtyard. The project is in commemoration of

the 100th anniversary of the ASUO. Scotten will not know if the project will happen until after he presents the proposal to the Student Senate for approval next term.

Both Scotten and Banfield said they feel they accomplished much of what they said they would, but they do not pretend to have tackled all the issues. "We've done a pretty good job," Banfield said, "but on the same token, a year is not really enough time to really say yes, we did it all, it was perfect. And I would be lying if I said yes."

"When it's your first time doing something, you sometimes just do what you have to do, and you do what you can, and do the best that you can," he said. "But I do feel that we did a lot of work. We were

very vocal on a lot of issues, and we stepped up to the plate. We weren't behind closed doors all the time. We were at the forefront of a lot of the major issues. And of course, with more time we probably could have done a better job. But all in all I think it was a very good year."

"There's a lot of work that goes on behind the scenes that may or may not get appreciated," Scotten said. "We tried really hard to professionally and effectively represent the students...and that's a pretty unique challenge."

Banfield credits the ASUO staff for much of his and Scotten's success. "We had a great staff that helped us throughout the year," Banfield said. "Without our staff we would have been lost."

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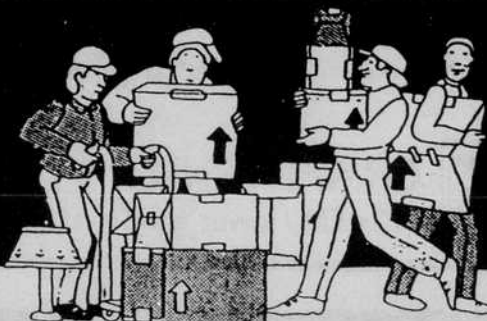
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
