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during the remodeling process. "This amphitheater would take the existing courtyard and create a true forum," Miller said. "If we can marry this project to the demolition project, we can save about \$25,000 off what it would cost at any other time."

Miller emphasized that the ASUO Student Senate will need to act "as a partner" in funding the amphitheater. The remainder of the proposed funding — which the Senate will decide on later this month — would come from the over-realized funds.

The EMU Board did not allocate \$100,000 as proposed on the grounds that the money is from a building reserves fund — money that is usually used for unforeseen EMU repairs.

"The Board said it gave \$50,000

that it couldn't really afford, so this action sends a strong message of support for the amphitheater," Scotten said. "We can't say 'no' to funding — any helps."

However, several board members expressed concern about the Senate being frugal in regard to funding the amphitheater.

"I would hate to go forward and watch two groups play games with each other and lose the whole project," EMU Associate Director Frank Geltner, Jr. said. "This is a difficult decision, but I think we should support it now, and hopefully they won't need the whole \$100,000 from us."

The EMU Board also discussed the changing future of Footnotes. The Board is in the process of deciding whether to rescind its earlier decision to renew Footnotes' lease.

This re-evaluation is based on a statement written by the Footnotes Board of Directors supporting the deletion of an EMU Board member's class subscription at Footnotes and maintaining that similar action could happen in the future if deemed necessary.

While EMU Board members said the deletion was an act of political discrimination, the Footnotes Board maintains that this was instead a political move.

Footnotes Coordinator Kristin King, who deleted the file and later apologized, said the deletion "was not a discriminatory move, but an attention-getting move."

"Why were Board members not lobbied to be allies instead of taking action like this?" asked board member Geneva Wortman.

The ASUO Executive is currently handling the grievance

filed against Footnotes about the deletion of the files. Scotten said the ASUO Executive will make an executive decision on the status of Footnotes late next week.

"We cannot have a situation where people are denying students' service," Scotten said. "The [EMU] Board is opening a huge Pandora's box if it allows this sort of discriminatory behavior."

The EMU Board also heard a special request and a new space allocation idea. The EMU Outdoor Program requested the EMU Board's permission to go to the ASUO Student Senate to make a special request for money from the surplus fund for a replacement van.

The proposal is to ask the Senate for money and the program would match the other half. In addition, an EMU Rental Informa-
