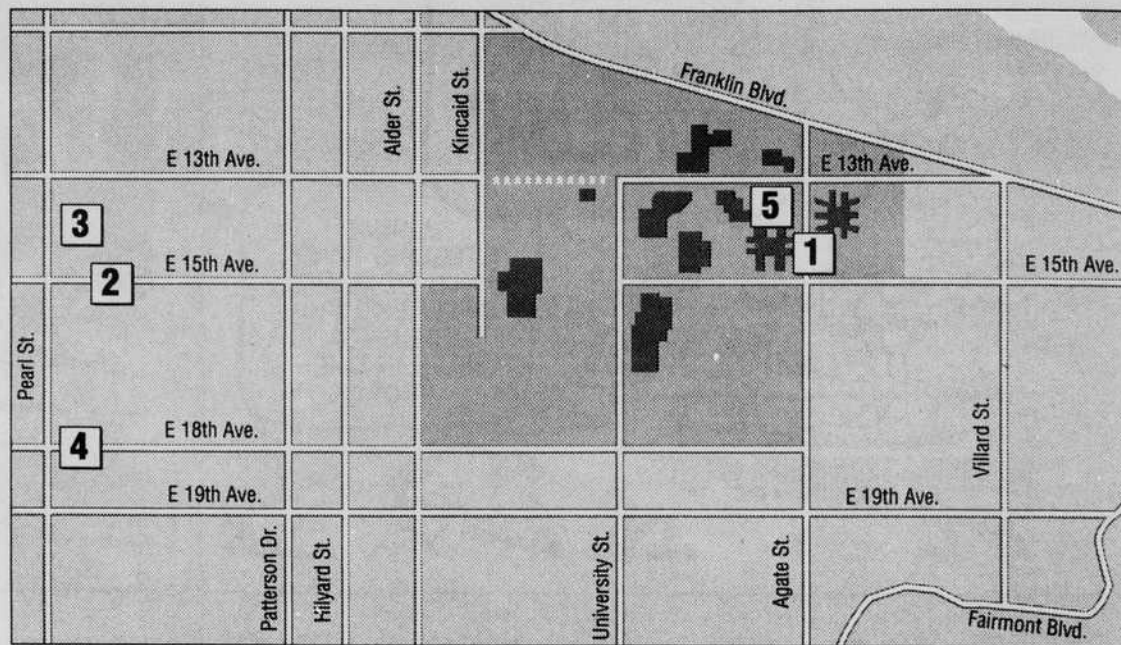

POLICE BEAT

Bike thief arrested

1 When officers from public safety were alerted by an unknown caller to a bike theft taking place on campus they arrived at approximately 7:25 p.m. on April 4 to find a 28-year-old male leaving the area on a bike that matched the caller's description, police reports stated. An attempt to stop the suspect resulted in his eluding the officers and riding the bike out onto Agate Street into heavy traffic. When the officers cut off his travel route, he dropped the bike and took off on foot. After a brief foot pursuit the suspect was apprehended.

According to police reports, he was asked if the purpose for his stealing the bike was to sell it, to which he replied: "No, man ... I just wanted to get back home to Springfield." He was charged with Theft I and Trespass II and lodged at the Lane County Adult Correction Facility. OPS was unable to locate the owner of the bike.

Including this one, there were four bikes reported stolen from the campus area in the last week. The estimated value totaled \$2,450.

Police spot keg cups

2 When Eugene police officers investigated a disorderly party on 376 E. 15th Ave. at approximately 10:29 p.m. on April 4 they found about twenty or more young people outside on the house's porch drinking beverages out of plastic cups that, according to police reports, resembled those typically associated with a keg. Officers found kegs and attempted to locate the receipts for them. A member of the party admitted to having bought the kegs and provided the receipts. The address on the receipts was different from the address of the party. The buyer of the kegs told police this was because he did not know the address of the party when he purchased the kegs so he put down his own address instead. Police seized both kegs and the individual was charged with false swearing on a keg receipt.

Boy found with bottle

3 A 17-year-old male was charged with minor in possession at a party that took place at 473 E. 14th Ave. at around 10:30 p.m. on April 5. He was walking

out with a large green bottle of alcoholic beverage in his hand. When he saw them he tried to hide the bottle behind his back. After a brief investigation, the individual was cited.

Loud party stopped

4 Officers observed a lot of music and yelling coming from an apartment at 500 E. 18th Ave. at approximately 10:40 p.m. on April 5 while responding to a loud party complaint. The host of the party was cited for a noise disturbance because of the "magnitude of the noise and the fact that the complainant was too afraid to identify themselves," police reports stated.

Officers smell beer

5 Officers from the Eugene police department charged a University student with being a minor in possession when they smelled beer on his breath outside of Dunn Hall at 1:20 a.m. on April 5. He admitted to having drunk two-and-a-half beers and was released after the citation was issued.
