The Smith/John ticket, however, has more parking as part of their campaign promises. Brandon said they want to work to widen Moss Street to provide more parking. Also, he said they would like to find a way to provide transportation to and from Autzen Stadium so students could use the stadium for parking.

Student involvement was another concern for the candidates. The candidates talked about the need to make the EMU and the ASUO office more open places for students to come.

Brandon Smith and Asha John propose handing out coffee to students on a regular basis as a way for students to get to know the student government.

Boyd and Oberriter echoed the concern of getting students involved on campus. Boyd said ad-

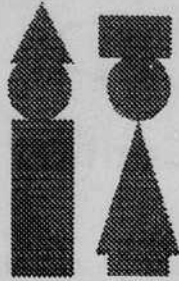
vertising events is important to getting students involved. Oberriter said, "You have to get out there and do it. I plan on walking a lot next year.... And talking to students and letting them know what's going on."

Issues of recruitment and retention of minority students were also addressed by the students.

Miner said the role of the multicultural advocates is important in improving recruitment and retention. Also, "working with the administration is very important," Miner said.

Ositis suggested working closer with the Office of Admissions in order to see what needs to be done in the area of recruitment and retention.

The candidates also discussed improving student programs while keeping down incidental fees and racial problems on campus.

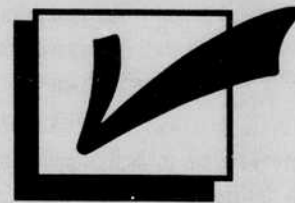
