"I think it's time for us to stand up and make decisions as the elected officials that we are," Scot-ten said.

During the meeting the ASUO predicted that if all of the ballot measures pass, students will pay

a total of \$147.81 in incidental fees for 1996-97. The figure is an increase of 9.45 percent.

The senate also voted to give the UO Cultural Forum \$2000 for the Caliente celebration during the Ben Linder commemoration.

Model United Nations request-

ed \$2973 as compensation for the money they spent during their yearly conference. The senate gave the group \$700.

The Office of Student Life received \$1215 because Jackie Gibson of the Mediation Program is retiring.

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that voter turnout mark, Whipple said.

In March, the elections at Oregon State University saw a 10 percent voter turnout in their student government elections. In comparison, the ASUO had a 16.5 percent turnout last spring.

"We're excited to help set a new record," Elections coordinator Stacy Harding said in a news release. "Last year's election turnout showed that more students are interested in where their money goes and how their school is run... We think we can beat last year's turnout."

"There may be an upward trend here," Whipple said. "The 20 percent goal has been a good way to keep focused."

However, 20 percent of the University student

body is roughly 3,000 students.

"I guess voter apathy is bound to happen in any political process, but that's definitely not a reason for some students to let others make the decision for them," Whipple said.

Another change in the elections is the new computerized system used for tracking whether or not a student has voted and if a student is currently enrolled at the University.

Candidates' visibility will be increased during a debate on Tuesday at 7 p.m. in the Ben Linder Forum with the two ASUO President and Vice president parties.

Voting booths close at 5 p.m. today, and the general election is April 23 and 24. Electees take office on May 25.

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
