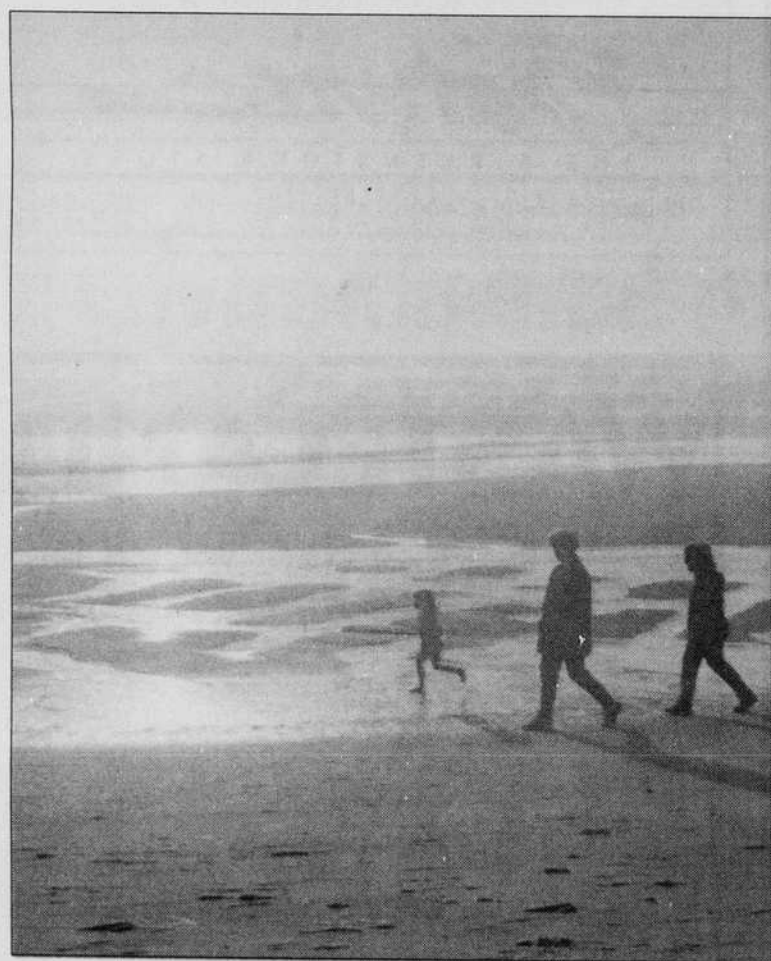
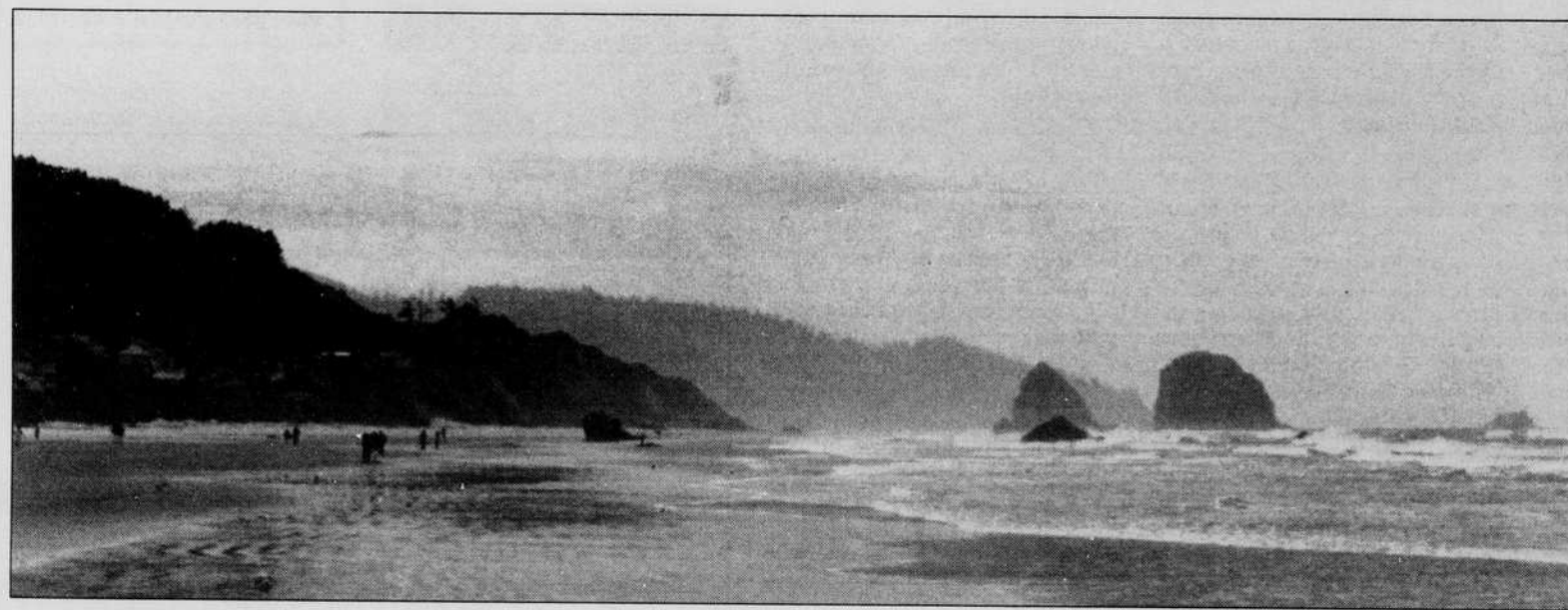
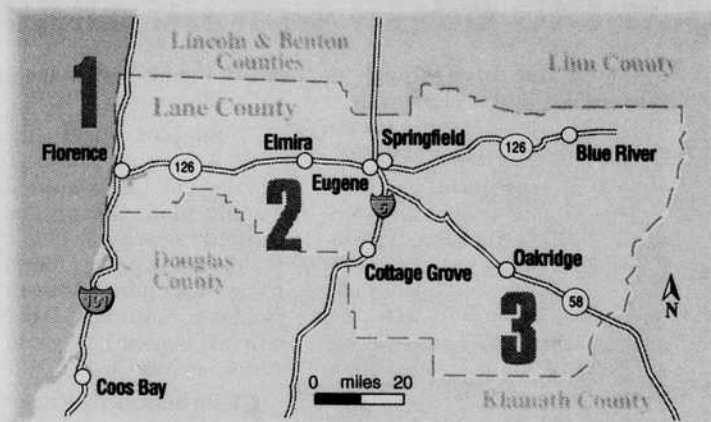
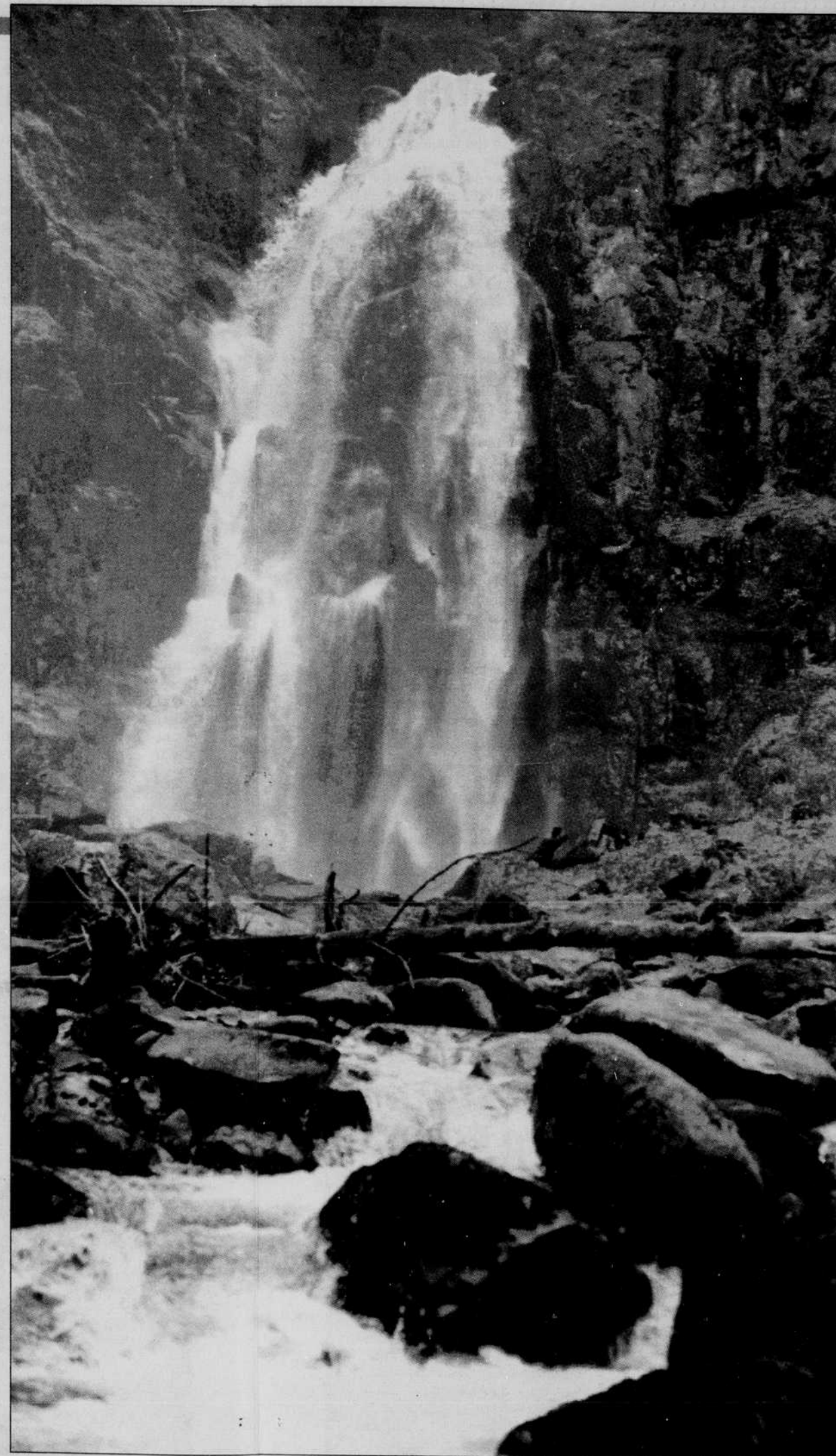

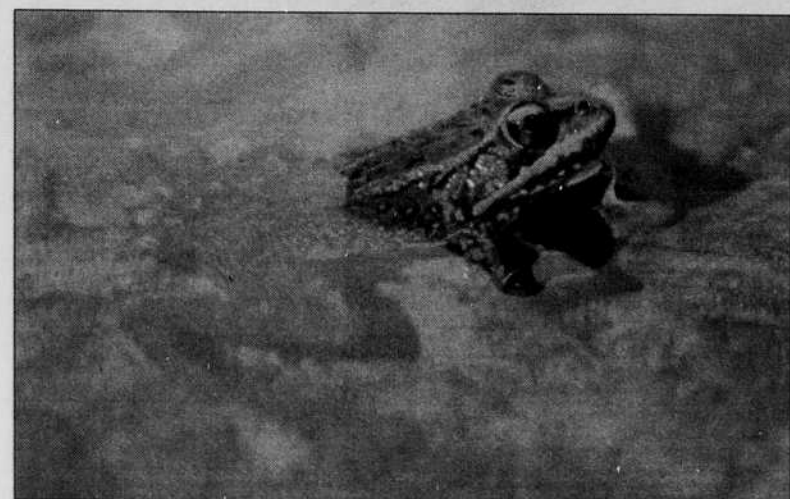

3 The Willamette National Forest is the home of Waldo Lake, far right, one of the world's purest fresh water lakes. Located 55 miles southeast of Eugene, the naturally created lake is a sanctuary for many delicate creatures, such as this frog, right.



2 The Kentucky Falls Trail is located nearly 40 miles west of Eugene. Sometimes called the Twin Falls Trail, this 2.3-mile hike along a tributary of the Siuslaw River has several waterfalls along its path and ends with two waterfalls side-by-side. It can only be reached via a logging road and is one of Oregon's best-kept secrets
