Baumgartner, three golfers earn Pacific-10 honors

Oregon women's golf coach Renee Baumgartner was named the 1997 Pacific-10 Conference Women's Golf Coach of the Year Friday.

Baumgartner led the Ducks to a No. 12 ranking in 1996-97 and a fifth-place finish at the conference tournament last week. She has taken her team to four team titles this season, including the first two of the season.

In 1993, Baumgartner took the Ducks to their only appearance in the NCAA Tournament, where they finished 17th.

This is the first time Baumgartner has received this award.

Three Oregon golfers were named to the all-Pacific-10 Conference teams Friday.

Paula Patterson was named to the first-team and Anika Heuser and Kylie Wilson were honorable mention selections.

Patterson's selection to the first-team makes her the first Duck to earn such honors. She finished ninth at the conference tournament and is currently the No. 27 player in the nation.

DePaul's Meyer forced to resign after 13 years

CHICAGO (AP) — Joey Meyer resigned under fire Monday as head basketball coach at DePaul, ending a 55-year family affair during which the Blue Demons have been coached by a Meyer.

Meyer, 48, spent 30 years at the school as a player, assistant coach and then head coach. He was a player and assistant under his father, Ray, who became the seventh DePaul coach in 1942. Joey Meyer replaced his father when Ray retired in 1984.

Bailey says race won't decide world's fastest man

AUSTIN, Texas (AP) — Donovan Bailey says his 150-meter match race against Michael Johnson will be about Canada vs. the United States, flamboyance against intensity and a short sprinter taking on a long sprinter.

The race on June 1 in Toronto will not, however, be a battle for the title of "world's fastest man," said Bailey, the world holder and reigning Olympic champion in the 100-meter dash.

Johnson is the world record holder in the 200-meter dash and Olympic champion in the 200 and 400 meters.

"The fastest man runs on a straightaway," Bailey said, alluding to the fact the 150-meter race against Johnson will include 75 meters of curve and 75 meters of straightaway.

Ultimate teams earn No. 1 seeds

In 1992, the Oregon men's team rode a late-season win streak to its first-ever national championship. That same season the Oregon women's team took second at nationals.

This season, the women's team is currently No. 11 in the country and had an impressive showing in the sectional championships last weekend.

"We really are playing our best ultimate of the season," team captain Aurora della Cruz said. "We feel great about our chances to be one of the top three in the

region and compete well at nationals in June. I think we're peaking at just the right time."

Oregon beat Oregon State 13-1 in the first round of Saturday's sectional championships. In the second round, the Ducks beat Humboldt State 13-3 to capture a No. 1 seed at the regional championships next weekend in Santa Cruz, Calif.

The men's bracket at sectionals had four teams: Humboldt State, Lewis and Clark, Oregon State and Oregon. Al-

though the Ducks were the favorite to sweep through the tournament, they struggled in a second-round loss to Oregon State.

In the third round, Oregon jumped out on top of Humboldt State early. The 15-4 win was the men's second of the day and clinched a No. 1 seed at the regional championships.

"The whole team is pleased with the way we played on Saturday," team coordinator Gatson Cunningham said. "One of our goals at the beginning of the year was to be the top seed at regionals and it feels good to achieve your goal."

Both teams will travel Friday to compete in the two-day regional tournament. The top three teams at regionals will compete in nationals in Davis, Calif. the first weekend in June.

Oregon gets past OSU and Washington for title

The Oregon men's and women's golf teams joined forces in Portland Monday for the Northwest Challenge and they came away victorious.

The four Northwest Pacific-10 Conference schools, Oregon, Washington, Oregon State and Washington State, battled it out in a mixed-doubles pairing, best ball tournament that proved to be a worthwhile competition.

The Ducks were paired with Oregon State in the morning session and the two teams battled it out to the end. The two teams were tied with two victories apiece in the best of five session and it was up to Pam Sowden and Jason Mattaini to pull through for the Ducks to get to the championship round. It took two extra holes to decide the victory but Sowden and Mattaini pulled through with the win.

In the afternoon session it was

Oregon matched up against Washington, who beat Washington State in the morning session, for the championship. Once again it came down to the wire, but this time it was Paula Patterson and Joel Stocker who pulled it out for the Ducks in the end, winning on the fifth playoff hole, giving Oregon the first ever Northwest Challenge Championship.

"This is the first time this has been done," Oregon coach Steve Nosler said. "It was scheduled to give people in the Northwest a perception of how the Oregon golf teams have come along. It's important for recruiting and alumni relations."

Also Monday, the women's golf team earned a selection to participate in West Regional Tournament in Tucson Ariz., May 8-10, their

fifth consecutive nomination. Twenty teams were chosen to play and the Ducks are ranked fifth in the Far West Region. Also the women's head coach, Renee Baumgartner, was named the Pac-10 Conference Coach of the Year.

The men will get back into action starting next Monday as they host the Pac-10 Championship at the Eugene Country Club.
