

Softball: Oregon rallies to tie second game with seven-run fifth

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fall. If we don't hit, we play good defense and if we play good defense we don't hit, so it's nice to put it all together."

The Ducks started the game off by roughing up Washington ace Jennifer Spediacci for three runs in the first inning.

Jackie Ellis led off with a single for the Ducks and advanced to second on a sacrifice bunt by Angie LeRoy. After Lindsey Welch was hit by a pitch, Heather Holte doubled to drive in Ellis. Then Cook stepped to the plate and showed she can do more than just pitch by smacking a two-run single to put the Ducks up 3-0.

Oregon added a run in the second inning, and it was all up to Cook and the Ducks' flawless play in the field after that.

The Ducks were led at the plate by Ellis, who went 3-for-4

with two runs scored, and Cook, who was 1-for-2 with the two RBI.

"We played well in the first game," Oregon head coach Rick Gamez said. "[Cook] threw a great ball game. She's been throwing well like that for a long time now, we just finally got some more runs and played good defense."

While the defense was a highlight of the first game, it was a lowlight in the second game, when the Ducks committed eight errors, seven in the first five innings as they fell behind 7-0.

However, a furious rally in the fifth inning saw the Ducks score seven runs and tie the game.

Cook, who also pitched the entire second game, led off the inning with a solo home run to get the Ducks on the

scoreboard.

Oregon went on to send 11 batters to the plate in the inning, getting hits from Jennifer Apfelbaum, Welch, LeRoy, Holte and another from Cook. Cook's second hit of the inning scored two runs that tied the game.

Washington head coach Teresa Wilson was thrown out of the game in the fifth inning for arguing a call at the plate.

Perhaps that fired up the Huskies, who scored two runs in the seventh inning on four straight hits to regain the lead at 9-7. The Ducks went 1-2-3 in their half of the inning and that was the ball game.

Next up for the Ducks is a doubleheader Thursday against Oregon State, beginning at 3 p.m. in Corvallis.

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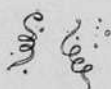
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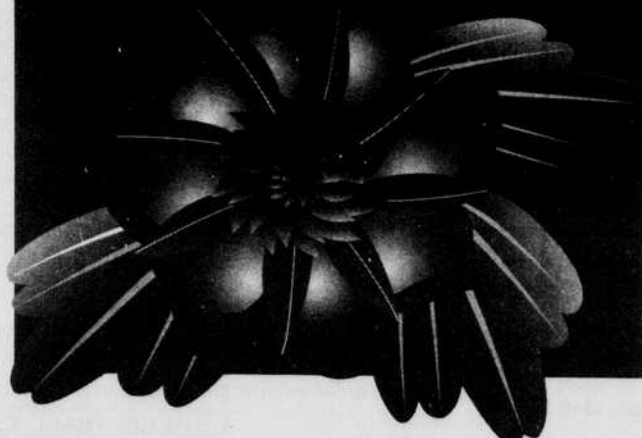
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
