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UO student shot during robbery

A college student was shot in the leg during a robbery near campus over the weekend, according to a police department news release.

Police responded to a report of shots being fired just west of the University campus on E. 16th Avenue at 2:24 a.m. on Sunday.

An area check was conducted by the Eugene police department and an officer on the scene found

the victim, who said he had been robbed and shot by an unknown assailant, the report said.

The student had a gunshot wound in the back of his leg. He was taken to Sacred Heart Medical Center and released Sunday afternoon, a hospital spokesperson said.

According to the police report, three men, one of whom was carrying a case of beer, had been walking along E. 16th Avenue from Alder Street when a car pulled up beside them.

Five or six men got out of the car and a verbal confrontation occurred, which escalated when

one of the men from the car attacked the man with the case of beer, said the police report.

The other two men ran from the scene. One of the men from the car fired a number of shots at the men who were running away.

When police arrived to investigate, they found one of the men had a bullet wound the back of his leg.

Police would not release the name of the victim because the case is still under investigation, said Jan Power, Eugene police department public information officer. The police have no suspects at this time.

of consciousness.

The next morning when the victim awoke, she found the suspect sleeping next to her. She got up and left the house alone and went to a nearby store to call a taxi. Police contacted her at Sacred Heart Medical Center where a friend convinced her to go to receive an examination.

Dahlstrom was located on Friday and after an investigation was charged with the listed offenses. He is currently being held at the Lane County jail and his arraignment is scheduled for 1:30 p.m. at the jail.

class A felonies and carry a maximum penalty of 20 years in prison. The maximum penalty for sexual abuse, a class B felony, is 10 years in prison.

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
