Oregon's club rugby team will host its final game of the season Saturday with a match against the Oregon alumni team at 1 p.m. on the Freshman Field.

Club triathlon competes in Corvallis

Three members of the UO club triathlon team competed at a meet in Corvallis on Monday.

The race included a 750-meter swim, a 20,000-meter (12.4-mile) cycling leg and a 5,000-meter (3.1-mile) run.

Chris Scheller finished third in the 20-25 age group in a time of 1 hour, 13 minutes. Shawn Stringham was fourth in the same age group in 1 hour, 20 minutes.

The team will compete at the Portland International Rose Festival Triathlon at Blue Lake in Troutdale on June 15. The meet consists of a 1.5-mile swim, a 40,000-meter (24.8-mile) cycling leg and a 10,000-meter run.

Rain ends national cycling championships

Stormy weather caused a rain-out of Saturday's road race at the National Collegiate Cycling Championships in Durango, Colo.

Oregon's Ryan and Erik Carlson qualified for the national championships two weeks ago in the last Northwest Collegiate Cycling Conference race of the season.

"It was a real disappointment," team captain Ryan Carlson said. "This was something we worked very hard for all season long and now we can't race."

Ryan did compete in Sunday's criterium race but failed to finish in the top 10.
