Measure: Change unneeded, foes say

The bill does not change wording in the ballot measure itself but expands the types of property tax levies that are subject to cuts under Measure 50 to achieve the overall 17 percent reduction.

The Legislature's legal counsel said that although the bill could conflict with some provisions of Measure 50, the Legislature basically "is free to specify greater tax

reductions than is required by Measure 50."

The bill, passed 33-27, "delivers to the public what we said it would do," Brian said. "We were trying to let voters know where we were taking this before the election."

He said it would have been worse in the public's mind to make the change after the election.

But Rep. Richard Devlin, D-Tulatin, protested that the House committee "committed the whole

Legislature to a course of action."

Foes of the bill, HB3710, argued that the change was not needed because the state Voters' Pamphlet and other material said the tax cut would be about \$800 million, the correct amount before the committee revised the implementing bill.

Rep. Tony Corcoran, D-Cottage Grove, said 70 percent of voters had cast their mail ballots before the committee took its action.

Center: LGBTQA will receive extra space

The EMU renovations will open up extra space for the LGBTQA — approximately 50 percent of Footnotes' current area. The space will be 400 square feet, occupied by all of the campus' homosexual organizations, if the applications are approved by the University Housing Committee and the EMU Board.

The office will serve the community and the campus community, and its central location will make it easier for students to find information about the services that are available on campus for homosexual students, Vittek said.

The LGBTQA — which used to be known as the LGBA — also applied to have the word "Transgendered" added to its name. Students, faculty and community members asked that the LGBA add "transgendered" to officially include transgendered persons in the association's name and activities. The

association's bylaws and mission statement are in the process of being changed and approved as well.

Stephanie Carnahan, director of the Lesbian Gay Bisexual Educational and Support Services Program, was nominated by 14 campus and community groups to receive the Pride Northwest Incorporated's "Spirit of Pride" award. Carnahan was nominated by the HIV Alliance, the LGBTQA, the LGLSA, the ASUO Women's Center, the University's Dean of Student Life, the Assistant Dean of Student Development and other community and campus groups.

The award is given to people who are active in the homosexual community. The award honors those who are activists in their communities and have had an impact on the life of the community. Carnahan will receive the award after the Portland Pride Celebration on June 21st.
