

Students will celebrate commencement in various ways

When the ringing of the bagpipes echoes between the walls of the memorial quad Saturday morning, one point will become clear to graduating seniors: *College is over. School is done. Today is commencement.*

A bagpiper will lead graduates of the School of Journalism and Communication from its home in Allen Hall to its commencement site behind Knight Library. The journalism school is the only department with this tradition. Some schools, departments and programs will observe other traditions at commencement. Others will break with tradition, and newer programs such as Environmental Studies will continue to mold them from infancy.

Environmental Studies found a rather unique speaker to deliver the time-honored tradition of the commencement speech: the graduating class. Dick Gale, the under-

graduate adviser for Environmental Studies, will ask each of the 90 graduating seniors a question. They will, in turn, answer.

"Last year, he asked where they thought they would be in a year," said Kris Ansell-Bell, the undergraduate secretary for Environmental Studies. "One woman said she was leaving for a mission with the Peace Corps the very next day. Another guy said he just hoped he had a job. It keeps the focus on the students," she said.

The Environmental Studies commencement will be held in the Paul Olum Atrium at 10 a.m. on Saturday, June 14.

The School of Architecture and Allied Arts will also slightly change the tradition of the commencement speaker. Beth Sherman, a graduate student majoring in architecture, will deliver the commencement speech — the first time a student has delivered the speech.

Rober Melnick, dean of the AAA school, selected her based

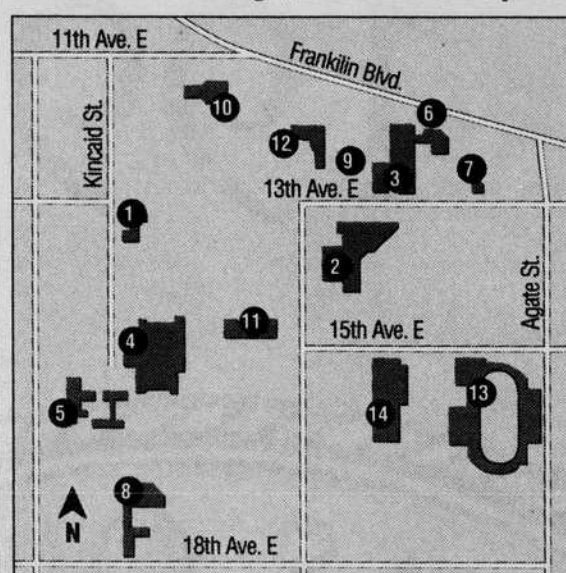
on her involvement with school and the community. The AAA commencement will begin at 3 p.m. on the South Lawn of the EMU.

Though students can't get a de-

gree in leadership, there are Military Science classes. The students who have run through the entire program will receive their officer's commission in the Army on Friday, June 13 at 3 p.m. in the

Gerlinger Lounge. Some will be commissioned as second-lieutenants in the regular, full-time Army, while others will be commissioned in the Reserves or National Guard.
