A look back at the past year's top 10 news stories at the University

1 STUDENT CONDUCT CODE
A new student conduct code addition was approved, requiring students to request and receive explicit consent before engaging in sexual activity. At a preliminary meeting about the code, the majority of people spoke in favor of the changes, while only two spoke in opposition.

2 MEASURE 47 CUTS
Measure 47 was passed, rolling back property taxes to their 1994-95 level, or, alternately, cutting them to 10 percent less than the 1995-1996 tax, whichever is smaller. Measure 47 limits the revenue available for schools and other local services funded by property taxes.

3 STUDENT SEATING
ASUO Executives held back 228 student tickets to a Friday night men's basketball game against Arizona at McArthur Court based on allegations of racial and homosexual slurs and unruly conduct by student fans at men's basketball games.

4 CONTROVERSY
University President Dave Frohn-mayer faced students who protested the University's decision to serve Gardenburgers in University dining halls. He also faced students who were concerned about Nike's influence at the University.

5 FUTURE OF FOOTNOTES
Footnotes has refused to stay in the EMU, and there is still debate whether to relocate or to dissolve the company.

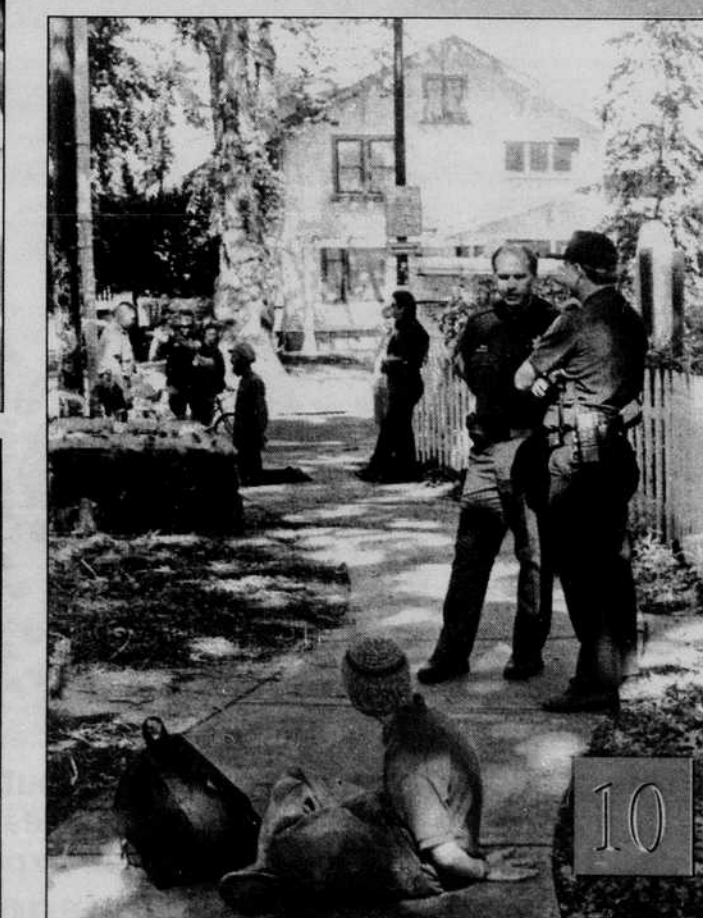
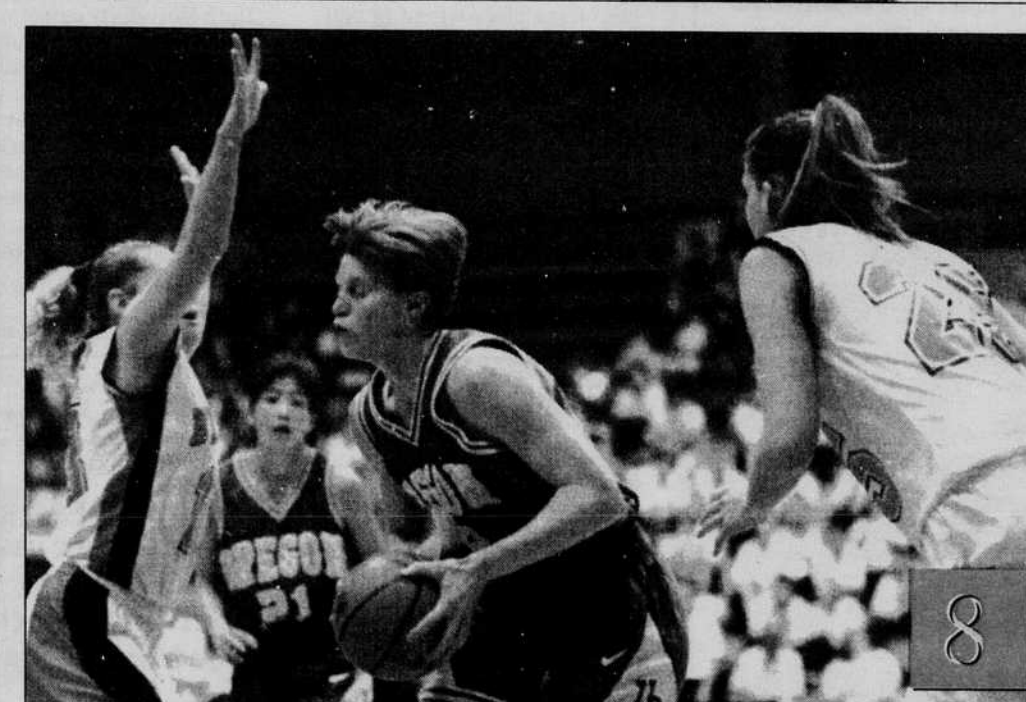
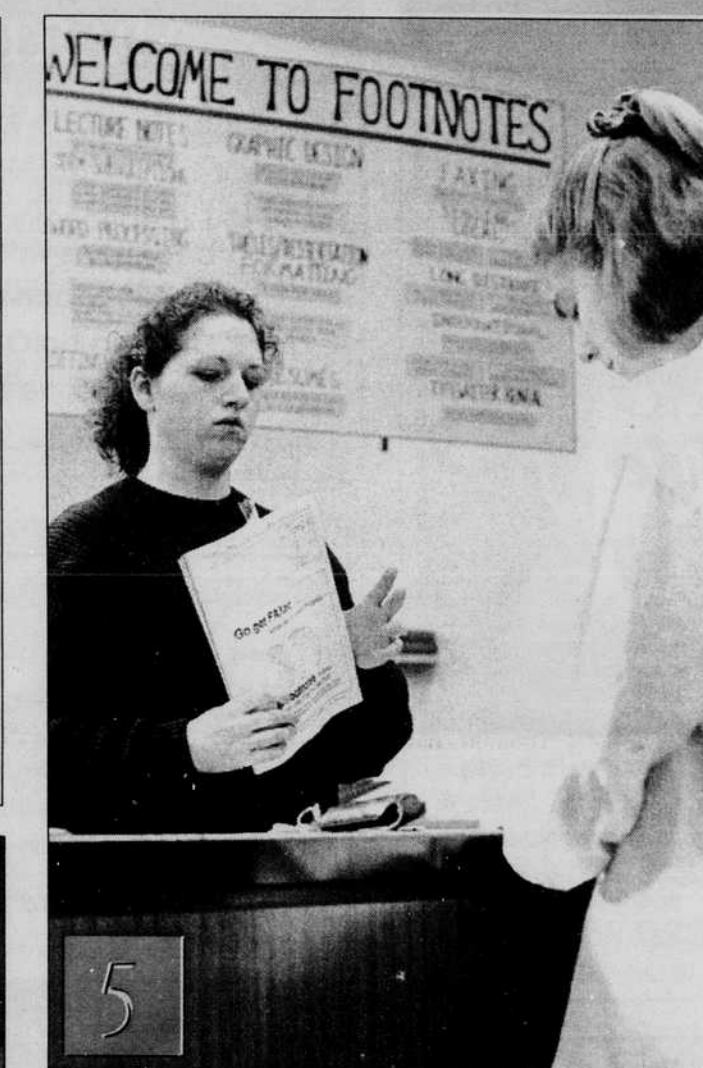
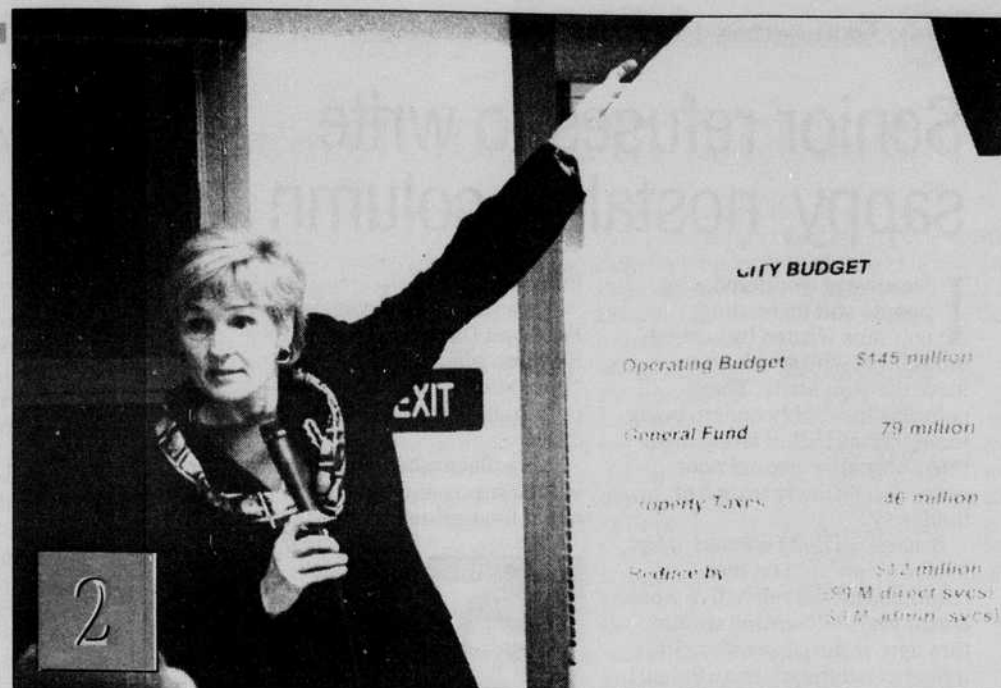
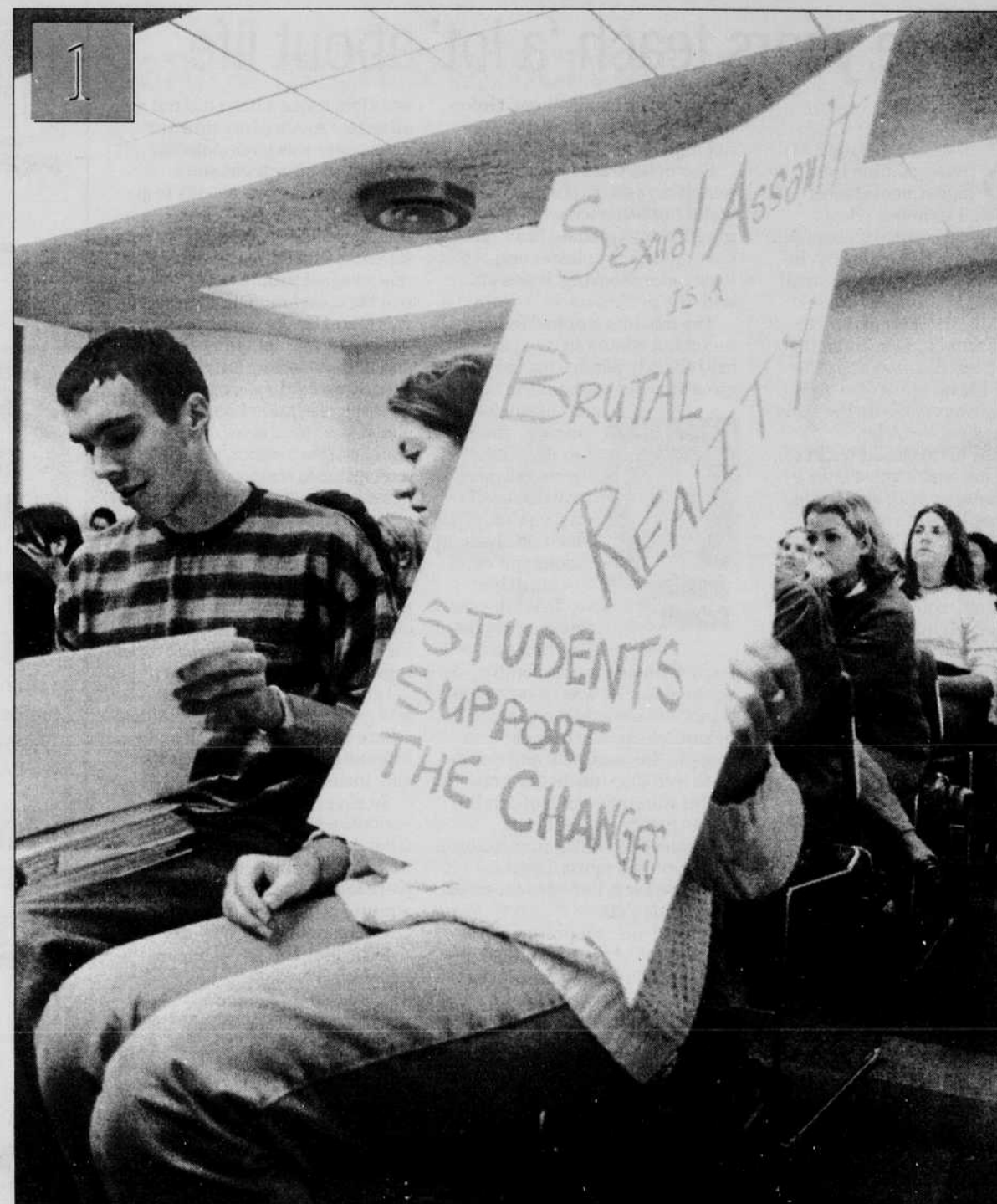
6 PRE
Warner Bros filmed *Pre*, a movie about local track star Steve Prefontaine, at Hayward Field during the summer. About 1,500 locals played enthusiastic track fans in the movie.

7 U2'S POPMART TOUR
U2 performed in front of a near-sellout crowd of 30,000 in a concert that literally rattled the University. The concert also opened doors for alterations to Autzen Stadium that will allow big-name performers to have access to the stadium. Several years ago, Pink Floyd was unable to perform in Eugene because of problems with the stadium.

8 NCAA TOURNAMENT
The Oregon women's basketball team advanced to the second round of the NCAA Tournament for the first time in three years with their win over San Diego State. They lost to this year's champion, Tennessee, in the second round.

9 ASUO ELECTIONS
This year's ASUO general election was postponed, and the Elections Board and the Miner/Unger campaign were named in petitions that charged wrongdoing.

10 WEST 13TH POLICE SWEEP
What began as neighborhood complaints of vagrancy and vandalism in the West University area sparked a wave of police crackdowns on the Eugene drug scene, resulting in many arrests.
