Boise starter Mark Harriger (0-
4) was matching Schurman early
in the contest. He retired nine of
the first 11 batters he faced and
gave up one hit through three in-
nings.

But in the fourth, Mark Burke
lifted a 0-and-1 offering over the
right-field fence to break the
scoreless tie and give the Ems a 1-
0 lead.

One inning later, Eugene sent
eight batters to the plate and
scored three runs with the aid of
three walks and two hits.

Al Castro started off the inning
when he doubled down the left-
field line, and Collin Wissen fol-
lowed with the first walk of the
inning to put runners on first and
second.

Leadoff hitter Pooh Hines bunt-
ed the two runners into scoring
position, and Manny Sanchez,
who went 2-for-5 with three RBIs,
scored Castro and Wissen with a
single over the head of the Hawks'
drawn-in shortstop to make the
score 3-0.

Two walks later, the bases were
loaded for Stewart Smothers, who
fled out to rightfield and scored
Sanchez to make the score 4-0.

In the sixth, Castro was hit in
the head and replaced by Brett
Pierce, who scored from second
on a single to rightfield by Hines

to push Eugene's lead to 5-0.

Schurman threw only eight
pitches in the seventh, his last in-
ning, while striking out his ninth
batter.

Wise replaced Schurman in
the eighth and got into trouble by
giving up two singles to the first
three hitters, putting runners on
first and second.

But one batter later, a diving
catch by Sanchez and putout at
first for the double play smothered
any of the Hawks' hopes for
a rally.

"At the time we had a five-run
lead, but that took the bat out of
their hands," Saul said of
Sanchez' play.

In the Ems' half of the eighth
they tattooed new pitcher Jason
Anderson for six runs on six hits,
including Spencer's grand slam.

The first six Ems hitters
recorded singles to score two
more runs.

Then Spencer, who came up
with the bases loaded, unloaded
on Anderson's offering to give
Eugene their 11-0 lead.

"When he missed with the
third curveball I knew he would
have to come back with a fastball
some time, and I got lucky,"
Spencer said of his fourth home
run of the season.
