Fewer students call residence halls home

University Housing is less crowded this year as students choose other living options

The rooms are small, the food is questionable and you're sharing the bathroom with a dozen other people.

Welcome home.

University Housing swung open its doors last week to about 3,100 students. That's close to the residence halls' "comfortable capacity," said Michael Eyster, director of University Housing.

That is substantially less than the demand in previous years, when the halls were overcrowded and students had to live in temporary housing.

New apartments that target students, such as Ducks' Village, cut into the demand for residence halls, Eyster explained. Student enrollment also declined this year, especially that of out-of-state freshmen, one of the primary groups of people who enter the residence halls, Eyster said.

University Housing nonethe-

less enjoyed a record day Wednesday when more than 1,500 people moved in, assistant director Kelly Matchett-Morris said. The residence halls had recommended residents arrive Wednesday, and most people complied, he said.

Fraternities and sororities sent members to help new students move in, Matchett-Morris said. Those helpers and others joined parents and students in lugging televisions and boxes up the stairs and into the rooms.

"This was way smooth," Matchett-Morris said. "It was a little hectic, but there weren't really any long lines. The only real problem was the traffic."

The Office of Public Safety closed bike lanes along Agate Street so cars could park there temporarily. An officer also helped direct traffic.

Most new residents said they were more concerned with making a dorm room home than with the traffic. Annie Wilcox of Roseburg found life in Bean Complex "a little small, kind of scary."

"Living in the dorm creates a little community," said Allison Daniels, from Portland.

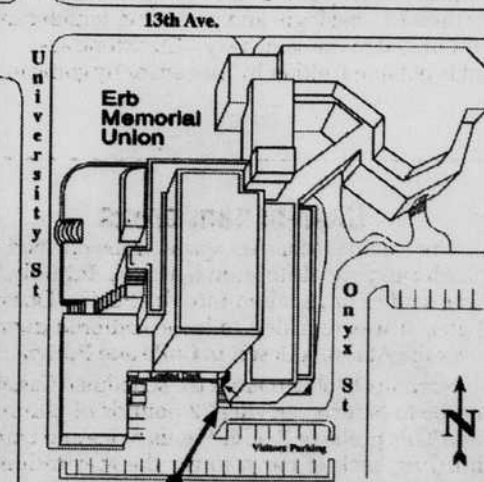
