OPS investigates phone harassment

1 The Office of Public Safety is investigating alleged phone harassment of a University student by an unknown suspect.

The student began receiving "calls of an unusual and threatening manner" in April 1997 from the suspect, who claimed to be affiliated with a long distance telephone company. The student asked to be taken off the call list. The calls persisted, at which time the victim contacted police.

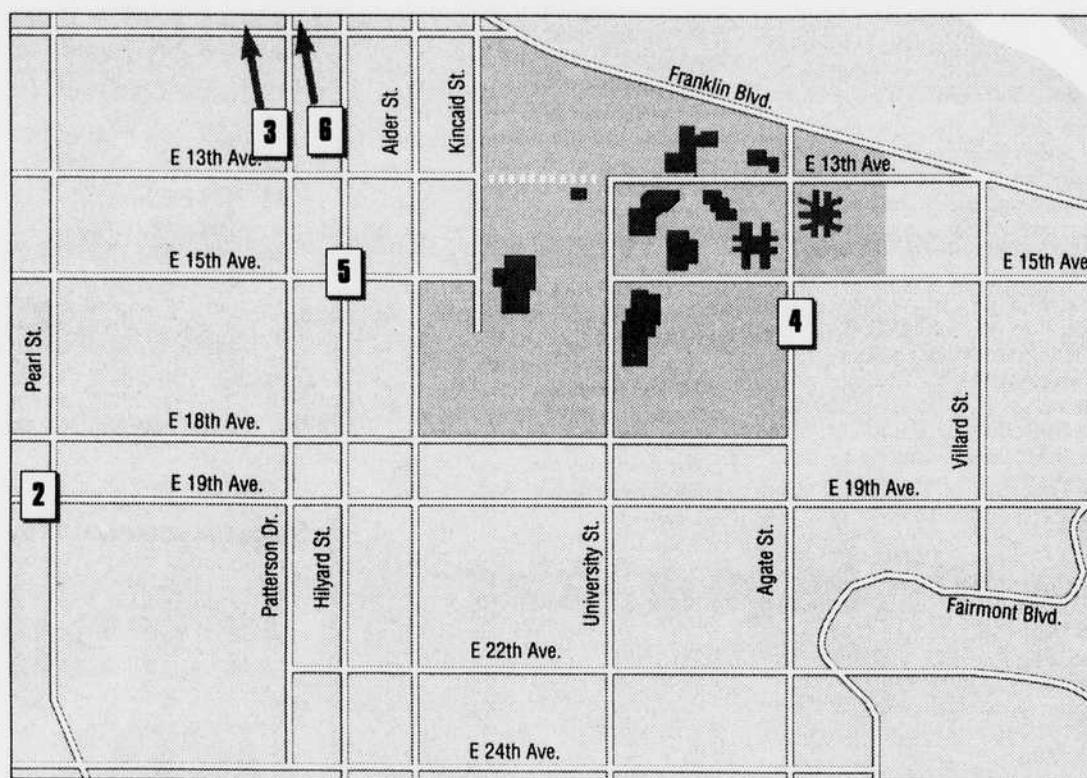
The suspect called the victim again. This time the victim complained about the calls and asked for the telephone number of a supervisor. An investigation revealed the number was not connected to a telephone company. The victim then contacted the police and was given a device to trace phone calls.

Upon returning this fall, the victim has been called by the suspect but has been unable to trace the calls.

House robbed over summer vacation

2 A University student returned to his house at 1125 E. 19th Ave. this fall to find some belongings missing and several of the windows broken.

The student left school in June with a deadbolt on the door to his room. He came back to find the door open and his futon, rollerblades, chair and phone missing.



Card reader stolen from University Inn

3 A card reader from the University Inn was stolen sometime during the night of Sept. 23 or early morning of Sept. 24.

A University employee last saw the reader at 10 p.m. on Sept. 23. It was discovered missing early on Sept. 24. The employee said about 100 people were in the building during the night.

The approximate value of the reader is \$400.

No suspect has been found and no further information is available.

Student tries to throw bike at safety officer

4 A University student was placed in jail Monday night after attempting to throw a bicycle at an OPS officer and trying to attack the officer with a U-Lock.

The incident occurred after the

Office of Public Safety received a call about a fight between two males. An officer approached the suspect on Agate Street and attempted to stop him near the crosswalk. The suspect was allegedly the instigator of a fight at Spiller Hall in the Hamilton Complex.

The student then tried to assault the officer with the bicycle and the U-Lock.

In response, the officer sprayed the suspect with pepper spray and

arrested him on a charge of menacing.

Earlier Monday night, the student had already been charged with minor in possession of alcohol.

Police end loud party, hand out one MIP

5 University public safety officers were called to a party on Sept. 26 at 10:28 p.m. by a neighbor complaining of excessive noise.

When the officers arrived at 493 E. 15th Ave. and announced their presence, many of the people inside, who appeared to the police to be minors, quickly left the house.

Officers handed out one citation for minor in possession. A resident of the house took responsibility for the gathering and was cited for noise disturbance.

Fire extinguished on fraternity's lawn

6 Public safety officers responded to a reported fire on the front lawn of the Beta Theta Pi fraternity house at 1009 Patterson St. on Sept. 27 at 7:48 p.m..

Officers arrived at the house to find several males taking turns riding bicycles off a burning ramp on the front lawn into Mill Creek. The ramp was set on fire using lighter fluid.

No action was taken against the suspects. Officers advised the fraternity president of city and state laws regarding prohibited burning.
