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Leaf: Cougars expect 'tough battle' at Autzen

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has stayed the same," Leaf says. "I've been able to learn since I came in as a freshman. I had that down last year, and I have it down even more this year."

"Now you face a lot of the same type of defenses and coverages and that allows me to go into the game and make decisions that Coach feels comfortable in me making. That's just a trust factor and me being around for awhile."

Leaf has been criticized during his career for his volatile nature and high emotions on the field, which could cause some observers to believe he would be a difficult player to coach. But Washington State head coach Mike Price says the opposite.

"He's so coachable, trying to be the best that he can be," Price says. "He's trying to work on his technique every game. He takes coaching very, very well and takes criticism and critical analysis very, very well and accepts it, gets on with it and tries to improve."

Leaf has received substantial recognition, but he insists it is not an individual accomplishment. He credits his teammates, especially his talented crew of receivers, for much of his success.

"I honestly don't do anything out there on that football field but throw them a four-yard pass, which isn't too hard," he says. "My little brother probably could do that. They just make the plays for us."

Nonetheless, Leaf has led his team to a 4-0 record (2-0 Pac-10) and has recently emerged as a legitimate candidate for the Heisman Trophy.

But Leaf says he isn't getting caught up in the hype.

"I just let my play speak for itself," he says. "I kind of like the way [Washington State has] done it this year. They haven't made a big deal about it. As long as I keep playing well or improving, that's the most I can ask."

"I appreciate the sports information people doing a great job of promoting me and things like

that — it feels good but I just want to go out and keep winning games."

Leaf says winning games is all that is important to him at this point in the season.

"You don't want to go out and play great but lose the ballgame," he says. "You want to go out and win and be the best you can. That's just the way everyone's looking at it. Every game is important from now on. We have 12 team goals and we've accomplished four of them."

Obviously, the team goals include representing the conference in the Rose Bowl for the first time since 1931, but Leaf doesn't want to hear anything about that right now.

"I'm just looking at our fifth goal of those twelve," he says. "The fifth one is Oregon right now. We'll cross that bridge Nov. 22 when the Apple Cup is over. Whether we're in that situation or not remains to be seen."

"Right now the main goal for us is the Oregon Ducks, in Eugene, in Autzen Stadium, Saturday at 1 o'clock."

Leaf says he is concerned about the Oregon defense despite the numbers it gave up against Stanford.

"They are a hardworking defense and aren't going to take losing — period," Leaf says. "They're just not going to take losses any more and playing at home against the Cougars is really going to fire them up, and I expect it to be a tough battle."

Leaf says he does not want a high-scoring shootout but with these two teams that might be hard to avoid.

"I'm just going to go into the game thinking that they're going to put up a lot of points, and we need to put up a lot of points.... Just find a way to win in this game."

Winning is something the Cougars have done consistently this season, and if Leaf continues to produce at the level he's currently at, they should continue to do so in the future.

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
