Fire dept. exercise will delay traffic

Between 1:30 p.m. and 4 p.m. today, residents traveling to and from West Eugene will face traffic delays due to a burning exercise on a house at 2190 W. 18th Ave.

Eugene Deputy Fire Marshal Mary Ellen Holly said that east-bound traffic will be coned off into one lane between City View and Chambers streets, while access to Cleveland Street off 18th Avenue will be closed.

For the past two weeks, members of the Eugene Fire and Emergency Medical Services have been using the donated house for various fire investigation activities, Wednesday's burn will give younger members of the fire crews an opportunity to learn suppression techniques, Holly said.

Hulteng endowment creates media ethics chair

Journalism Dean Tim Gleason believes the position will attract top notch talent

Elizabeth Hulteng, the widow of former journalism Dean John Hulteng, announced a \$1.5 million endowment for a John L. Hulteng Chair of Media Ethics and Responsibility September 19, and since then the School of Journalism and Communication staff has been searching to fill the position.

"[John] Hulteng was a very distinguished and nationally known teacher of media ethics," journalism Dean Tim Gleason said. "He wrote several books that are landmarks in the field. We may fill the position with someone who will be teaching ethics."

Gleason said the journalism school staff is unsure where it will look to fill the position.

"It could possibly be [that] someone on this faculty will be named," Gleason said. "We, as a faculty, have not discussed whether it will be or not, but it will definitely be someone who has a distinguished record and who has the potential to teach ethics in the school."

The person to fill the Hulteng chair will join two other chair positions already established in the journalism school. Professor Jim Upshaw currently holds the Chambers Chair of Broadcast Journalism and Professor Charlie Frazer holds the Chambers Chair of Advertising.

A chair's duties are very much the same as a professorship, except interest from the endowment goes to pay the chair's salary and research and travel ex-

penses. Gleason said having an open chair position is very advantageous for the journalism school's students and staff.

"It enhances our faculty by creating additional positions and by allowing us to recruit a very distinguished professor to come to the campus," Gleason said.

Meanwhile, renovations of the Hulteng Student Services Center, of which Elizabeth Hulteng is also the benefactor, have been completed, and faculty and students are now starting to move in. The center, located at the ground level of Allen Hall, is for-

merly the site of the University printing press. When the press moved to the Eugene Register-Guard buildings on High Street, the space became available for other uses.

The center became a part of a larger construction project consisting of the refurbishment of the Dunaway reading room and an electronic media center, in memory of journalism graduate Dorothy Willis.

The Student Services Center is expected to be up and running by mid-October. The center will contain the academic and career counseling offices, as well as peer advising.
