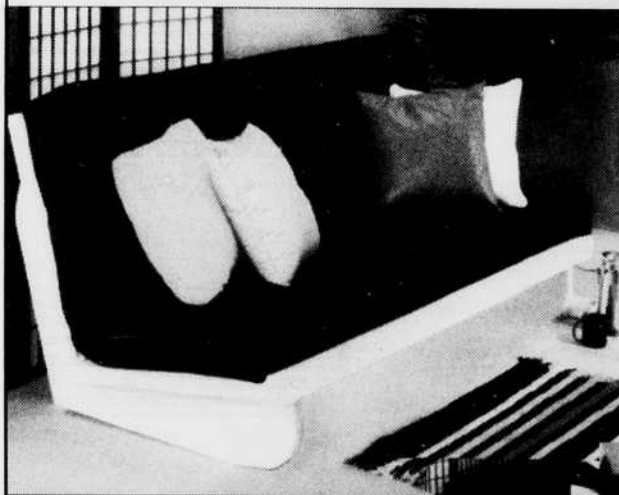


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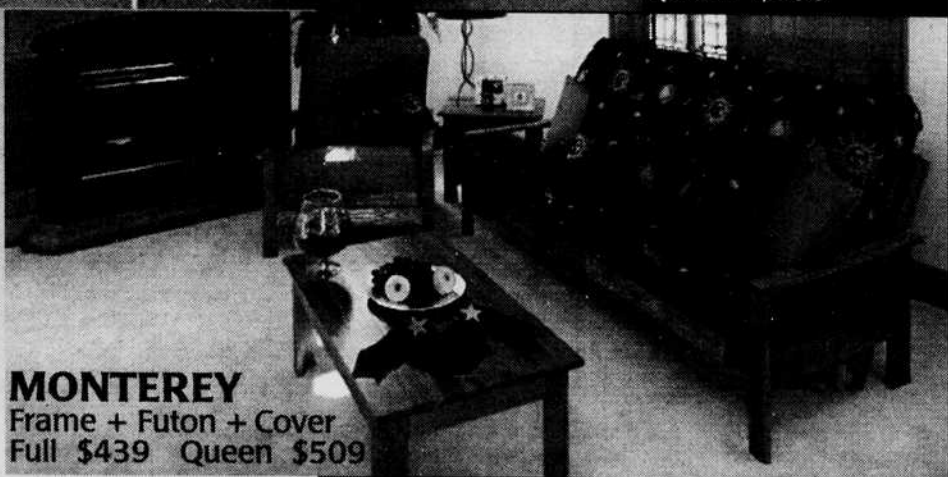
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Printing: ASUO wants to discuss options

number of pages a student can print for free in a year, Miner said. A student ID card could keep track of printing use and begin charging students after they reach the limit, he explained.

The University is also facing a deficit for its technology budget, Moseley said. The printing charge may be unfair to students, but the University is "up against a wall" and needs to find the money somewhere, he said.

The technology fee hasn't been increased in three years, while the University has dramatically improved its technology, Moseley added.

The University will meet with members of the ASUO next week to discuss other solutions to the waste and deficit problems, Moseley said.

"I'm perfectly willing to discuss this," he said. "But I'm just dealing with the reality."

Teenage violent crime drops for second year

WASHINGTON — Arrests of teenagers for violent crimes plunged 9.2 percent last year, and Attorney General Janet Reno said the second straight annual drop was not "a blip" but a real trend away from the juvenile crime wave that rose steadily from 1987 through 1994.

At her weekly news conference Thursday, Reno called on Congress to allocate more money for after-school programs "to make it stick." The Republicans who control Congress are writing bills that focus on trying more

teenagers as adults.

"This drop, I think, is real now," Reno said. "I don't think we can talk about it as a blip."

The drop during 1995 was 2.9 percent, and Reno said she had "worried since that it might be a blip. But now ... we are making real progress."

The FBI data also showed that arrests of teenagers for murder dropped 10.7 percent in 1996, the third straight annual decline after a 169 percent increase between 1984 and 1993, when the juvenile murder rate peaked.

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
