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week. They were held to just 51 yards rushing by the Huskies and got just one touchdown out of four trips inside the Washington 30-yard line. The Trojans rank first in the conference in rushing defense.

Utah State (2-3, 0-0) at Oregon State (2-2, 0-2)

The Beavers have a chance to go 3-2 for the first time since 1988, when they host the slumping Aggies.

The Aggies are on a three-game losing streak, but they are no

pushover. They lost 42-35 at No. 21 Brigham Young last weekend and 35-24 to Colorado State on Sept. 13 to begin the streak.

Last week's loss was a heart-breaker, with the Aggies owning a 24-10 lead early in the second quarter. They tied the game at 35-35 midway through the fourth quarter but gave up a time-consuming touchdown drive that sealed the victory for BYU.

Oregon State, meanwhile, defeated San Jose State 26-12. The Beavers need to find some offense in a hurry. They have scored just

two offensive touchdowns in the past two games.

Tailback DeShawn Williams, the Beavers' second-leading rusher, injured his knee against the Spartans and will be out four to six weeks. Redshirt freshman Ricky Walker will start in his absence. Walker rushed for 62 yards on 19 carries and caught a pass for 19 yards after replacing Williams last week.

Utah State quarterback Matt Sauk suffered a sprained ankle against BYU and is listed as day to day.

Three UO men's tennis players travel to Texas

No longer is just being there enough for Oregon.

Three Oregon men's tennis players will not be satisfied with just playing in the All-American Qualifying tournament in Austin, Texas.

Oregon head coach Chris Russell said the Ducks' goal is to have Guillermo Carter, Carlos Navarro and Erwan Kergroach all playing their way through the qualifying tournament and into the championships.

"I've got pretty high expectations going down there," Russell said Thursday. "Our top guys are playing good tennis right now."

The qualifying portion of the tournament begins Saturday and runs through Monday, and the championships begin two days later.

"I think all three have a legitimate chance, all are very capable" Russell said.

Navarro, particularly, should have a shot at advancing past the qualifying rounds. Earlier this month, Navarro played his way into the second round of the championships at the Clay Court Championships in Baltimore, where he lost to the 91st-ranked player in the nation.
