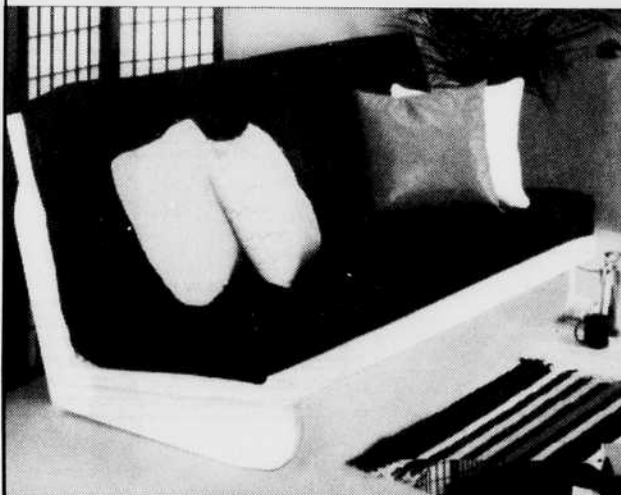

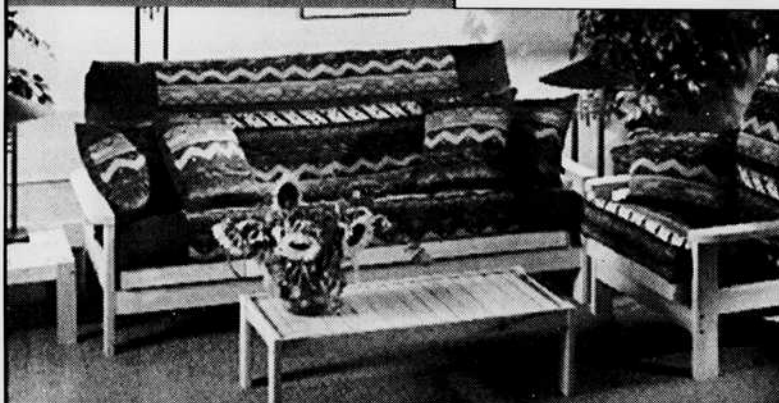

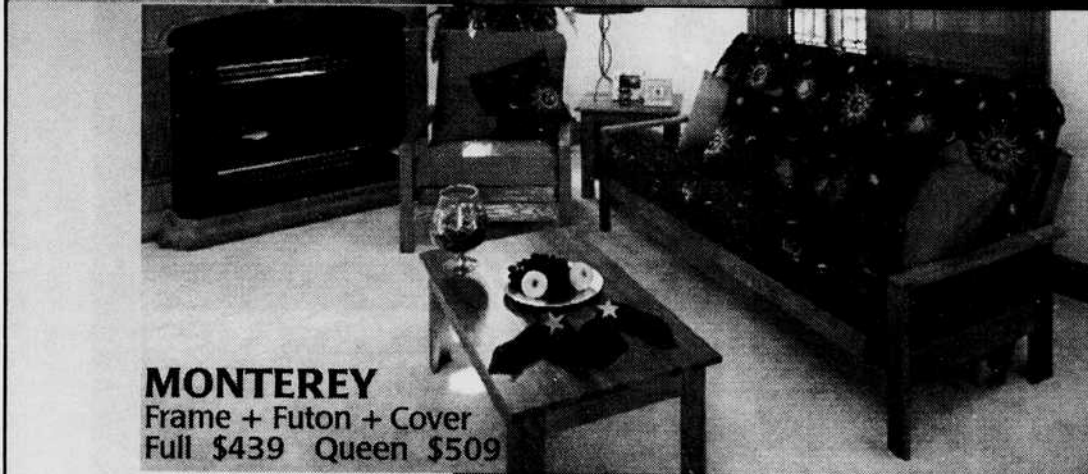

Golf teams travel to separate tournaments

The women will play in Redmond, Wash., while the men travel to Stateline, Nev.

While most students will spend the day in class today, several of Oregon's men and women golfers will be out on the links competing in key tournaments for both teams.

The Oregon women's golf team travels to Redmond, Wash., to compete with four other top-25 teams in the Edean Ihanfeldt Invitational.

In its 20th year, the Edean Ihanfeldt Invitational has attracted several of the country's top women's teams, including No. 3 Tulsa, No. 5 Brigham Young, No. 13 Florida, No. 23 San Jose State and host Washington.

The tournament is Oregon's third of the season and, arguably, its most difficult of the fall competition.

The No. 10 Ducks will be looking to rebound from a second-place finish two weeks ago at the Nike Northwest Invitational in Corvallis. Oregon carded a two-round total of 929, seven strokes off the pace of champion Oregon State.

Senior Paula Patterson, a first team All-American last season, was the Ducks' top finisher with

a 10th-place tie in the 36-hole tournament.

On the men's side, the Ducks will be at the Edgewood Country Club in Stateline, Nev., today and Tuesday for the Wolf Pack Classic.

The Ducks will try to bounce back from a disappointing 10th-place finish at the Nike Northwest Classic in Corvallis



Oct. 6 and 7, when they got off to a slow start and did not recover.

Ryan Lavoie led the Ducks in Corvallis with a 10th-place finish and had Oregon's low round of the tournament with a final round 69, finishing one-over par.

Lavoie again will be a key for the Ducks during this 19-team tournament.

Ben Crane and Derek Croskrey are also expected to figure in as key players for Oregon.

Crane helped lead the Ducks to a fourth-place finish while earning a first-place tie at the Pacific Invitational in September and was two-over at the Nike Northwest Classic.

Chris Cone and Nate Blauer are the other golfers making the trip for the Ducks.
