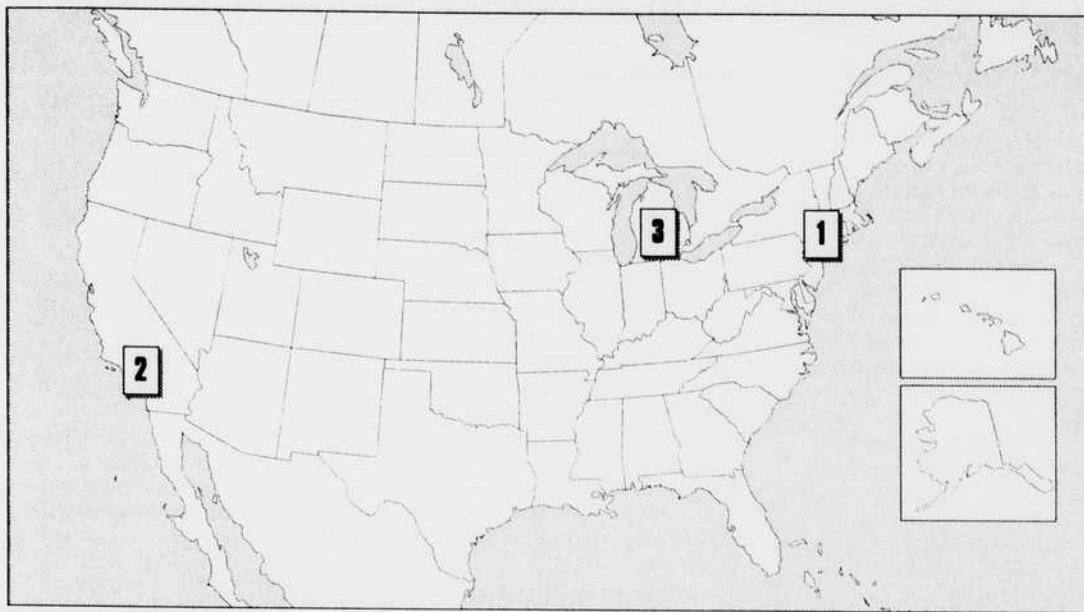

Woman killed at bus stop as children watch

1 LOWELL, Mass. — A young mother was shot at a bus stop in front of at least 16 schoolchildren Tuesday and died with two of her own youngsters holding her hand. Her former boyfriend was arrested hours later.

"Did you know my mother was dead?" Annie Glenn's oldest child, age 5, told his godmother as she comforted him and his younger brother and sister in a police station.

"I just hugged him," said the godmother, Lela Boykins Hall.

Richard Kenney, 35, was arrested about six hours after the shooting, in Cambridge, 25 miles south of Lowell, after police found the car witnesses had described.

Kenney was arrested on suspicion of murder. Kenney was the father of Ms. Glenn's two younger children.

2 young sisters killed by commuter train

2 UPLAND, Calif. — Two young sisters who wandered away from home and onto the railroad tracks were killed Tuesday when they were hit by a commuter train.

According to the Metrolink train engineer, 22-month-old Deziree Soto was on the tracks and her older sister, 3-year-old Alexes Robles, tried to pull her away as the 450-ton train came around a curve at 40 mph.

The engineer sounded the horn and made an emergency stop, but it took three-quarters of a mile for the train to stop. None of the 150 passengers on the San Bernardino-Los Angeles trip was hurt during the fast stop.

"The engineer has been taken out of service because he is very, very shaken up," said Metrolink spokesman Peter Hidalgo.

Mother goes on trial for slapping daughter

3 BRIGHTON, Mich. — A mother who admits to slapping her runaway daughter in the face says she shouldn't have been charged with a crime for simply administering parental discipline.

Debbie Skousen could get up to a year in jail if convicted of assault and domestic violence against her 18-year-old daughter.

"It has been a painful thing," Skousen said in Tuesday's Ann Arbor News. "It has so severed relationships between siblings that I don't know if they're ever going to talk to again. It really drove a wedge in my family."

In April, Skousen's daughter Rebecca, then a high school senior, took off for two days and refused to say where she had been. The mother said her daughter cursed at her, so she slapped her twice in the face.

Faculty and Staff \$4.00

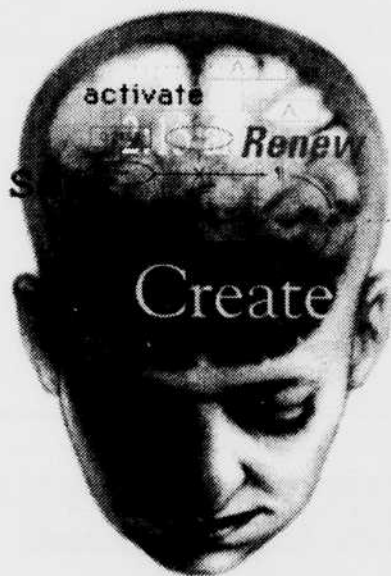
Annual flu immunizations are recommended for the following:
