Trojan: McCutcheon's father keeps him focused on the task at hand

Fast forward 17 years. Lawrence's son Daylon has become a star in his own right — on a somewhat smaller stage.

In his senior season at Bishop Amat High in La Puente, Calif., McCutcheon starred on all sides of the ball.

While at running back, he ran for a school record of 2,456 yards in just 269 carries. At defensive back, he had eight interceptions and 56 tackles. He caught passes at wide receiver and slot, and he returned punts and kickoffs, and of the 33 total touchdowns he scored in 1994, 10 were from 50 yards or farther.

After the season, McCutcheon's accolades came as frequent as head coaches' phone calls.

He was named a USA Today All-USA selection, a Parade All-American, a Super Prep All-American National MVP, a Blue Chip All-American, a College Sports All-American, a National Prep Poll All-American and received 13 other all-state or All-American awards.

And a star whose path to the NFL has been widened with the decision to go to USC.

"My goal, since I can remember, has always been to play in the NFL," McCutcheon says. "I think that you really have to love the game if you want to excel."

"The more games you play, the more you learn. Every game there's going to be something new."

Something new, and a new goal to work toward.

"My dad keeps me focused on what I have to do right now," McCutcheon says. "He won't really ever talk to me about the NFL. He has taught me that it's what I do today that counts. When it gets closer to the time that I'm ready to move on, then I know he'll give me a lot of great advice about the next level."

Having confidence on the football field and establishing goals as a player are all part of the maturation process of the student athlete, and McCutcheon isn't the only one who feels he has the tools to play in the NFL.

"He is an excellent, excellent athlete who can play just about anywhere in the defensive secondary and probably a lot of places on offense, too," Oregon head coach Mike Bellotti says. "He's got great speed, and he's a tough, aggressive, in-your-face cornerback that does not back down and who welcomes the personal challenge of one-on-one coverage."

With all frankness and honesty, McCutcheon admits he is destined for greatness at the next level, something his father, coach, teammates and opponents can't argue with.

people who would love to be in my shoes — to go out there and play in front of 70,000 or 80,000 people and be able to compete at a big time college level."

As a freshman at USC in 1995, McCutcheon found himself in a starting role at cornerback in only his fifth collegiate game.

It is a position he has never relinquished.

McCutcheon started six important games for the Trojans down the stretch, including the team's first Rose Bowl game since 1990. After the season he was named All-Pac-10 honorable mention.

"Experience is the key at any position," McCutcheon says.
