Bridge construction will limit traffic

New construction on the Ferry Street Bridge Project will limit north and southbound nighttime traffic to one lane in each direction starting today and continuing through Oct. 31.

Motorists traveling on the bridge between 7 p.m. and 6 a.m. are warned to reduce their speed, watch for warning signs and be prepared for traffic stops. Both southbound lanes will be closed between Third and Sixth avenues to allow for removal of the sidewalk on the west side of the bridge viaduct. In addition, the Sixth Avenue exit ramp will be closed at night next week.

A flagger will divert southbound traffic across the median into one of the two northbound

lanes and then back into the southbound lanes near Sixth Avenue. Northbound traffic will be limited to one lane between Seventh and Third avenues.

After the week-long project, much narrower southbound lanes will reopen.

Reception celebrates UO ethnic community

University students, staff and faculty of color will have a chance to get acquainted, eat food and enjoy music and art tonight.

The "Weaving New Beginnings: Building a Community" reception begins at 6 p.m. in the EMU Ballroom. It lasts until 9:30 p.m.

The event will include specially prepared food, entertainment, live music and art exhibits by the University's multicultural community.

The main purpose of the reception, however, is to bring together the University's ethnic community. Faculty members will be introduced and campus groups will staff information tables. Participants will be encouraged to meet each other and network.

"The significance of [the event] is that we are bringing together a community of color to mingle and to get to know one

another on a social level — outside of the classrooms and away from the administration offices," ASUO Multicultural Advocate Robert Wasson said.

Representatives from ethnic student unions, the ASUO, administration and faculty began planning the event months ago. It was conceived of as a way to pull together the University's multicultural community.

Almost 20 groups are sponsoring the event, including the Office of Student Life, the schools of music, law and journalism, the Counseling Center and the Office of the President. University President Dave Frohnmyer prepared a videotaped welcome for the event because he will be out of town.

The ASUO expects about 200 people to attend.
