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and civil damages. In such a case, the residents would have to pay for the police response and cleanup costs. In addition, the city wants to work with the University and see if expulsion of the students involved is possible.

"What I want to see happen is to find some way to easily stop what happens without someone getting hurt," Turner said.

But in cases of off-campus riots, Vice President for Administration Dan Williams said he is unsure where the jurisdiction of the University lies.

"We can't govern people's behavior off campus in any significant way," Williams said. "The best we can do is make people who behave this way think twice."

Williams spent Friday night with City Manager Vicki Elmer at City Hall to help monitor the situation.

"I'm disappointed, I'm just so disappointed that people choose to behave this way; it's inexcusable," Williams said.

Riot: Night was repeat of last year

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Lane County Sheriff's Office, Oregon State Police and the University Office of Public Safety helped break up the crowd.

The report said the crowd moved north on Alder Street, breaking bottles and light poles. Police used tear gas to disperse the crowd from the street. Many people in the crowd were taunting police to use tear gas, the report said.

After using tear gas, police used a saturation patrol — four officers in a patrol car — to search the West University neighborhood for other signs of trouble, according to the report.

Ryan Nelson, who lives in the neighborhood and witnessed the riot, said police used "general bullying" and an "abuse of power" in order to control the situation.

"I think it could have been handled a hell of a lot better," he said.

Lance Ball, a University student and another area resident, said a friend of legal age attempted to purchase alcohol at a local convenience store at approximately 12:30 a.m. on Saturday but was unable to do so because of police restrictions earlier in the night.

Last year on Halloween night, a crowd of more than 200 people threw rocks and bottles at police officers outside a party on University Street.

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
