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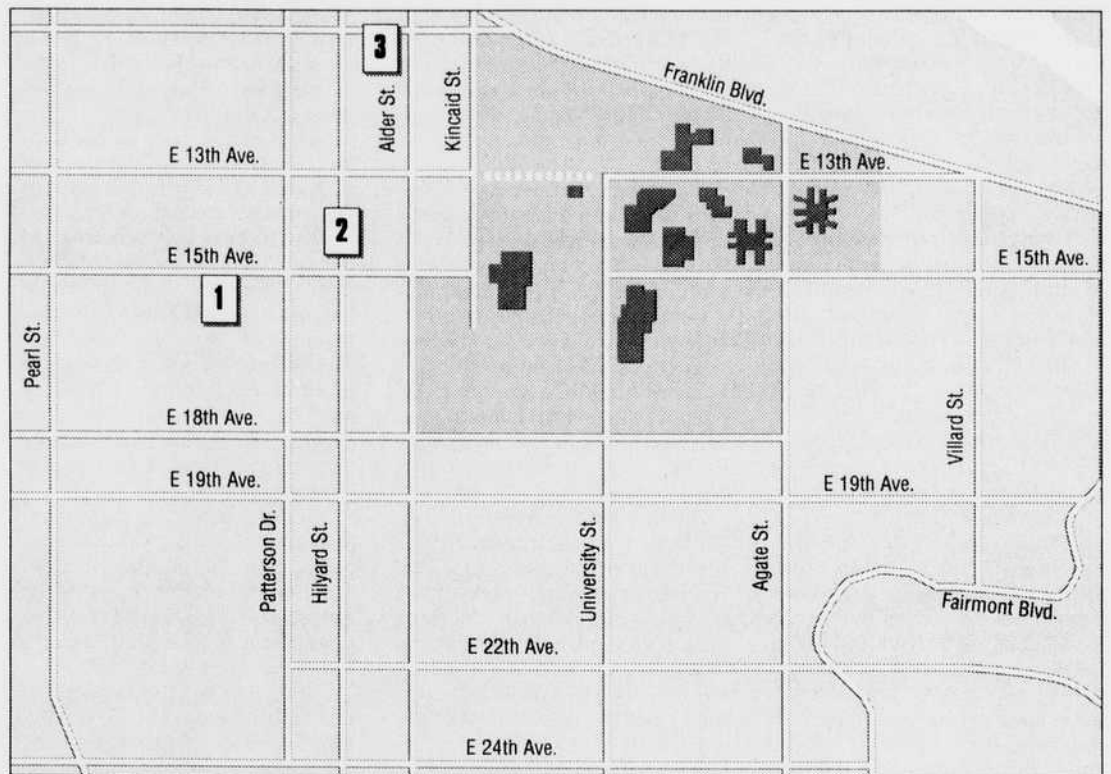
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POLICE BEAT



1 Officer prevented from entering party

Eugene police arrested and cited three Eugene residents for several violations after the officers broke up a party at about 1:40 a.m. Sunday at an apartment complex at 500 E. 15th St.

As they approached, officers heard loud voices and saw several people, who appeared to be underage, with beer cans outside of the complex.

As one of the officers attempted to enter the apartment, a female stepped in front of the officer, preventing him from entering. The officer then asked the female to move out of the way, and she responded by saying the officer did not have the right to enter the residence. When the female did not move, the officer detained and arrested her for interfering with police.

When the officer again attempted to enter the residence, the door was slammed and locked in his face. At this point, the officer requested the door be opened, and it was opened after a short period of time. Another female walked toward the officer, yelling at him. The officer then told the female to get back. Following no reaction by the female, the officer then detained and arrested her.

Officers later discovered many

people at the party apparently left through a back window of the apartment when the police arrived. Officers also found several marijuana plants in the closet of a male resident's room. The male was not present during the party.

A 19-year-old female University student, who was apparently watching the apartment for the male who was gone, took responsibility for the party. She was cited for noise disturbance, furnishing alcohol to minors and interfering with police. Her bail was set at \$930.

A 19-year-old male University student was cited for minor in possession of alcohol, with his bail set at \$150. A 22-year-old female from Piedmont, Calif., was cited for interfering with police. Her bail was set at \$350.

2 Police disperse large party, arrest five

Eugene police arrested five people on various counts after breaking up a large party at 1571 Hilyard St. around 10:31 p.m. Saturday.

People at the party told police that admittance to the party was based on naming one of about 60 people on a guest list, which was later presented to the police.

The arrest counts included furnishing alcohol to minors, unlawful sale of alcohol and false swear-

ing on a keg receipt. All five people arrested were residents of the address listed above.

3 Fraternity official issued noise citation

Eugene police arrested an official of Sigma Nu fraternity for noise disturbance after residents and guests of a nearby hotel complained of excessive noise on Friday night.

At about 11:40 p.m. an officer arrived at 763 E. 11th Ave., the site of the fraternity, and heard "large booming music" coming from the house. A person who identified himself as the treasurer of Sigma Nu was contacted. The official said he was sorry for the disturbance and offered to take responsibility for the actions at the house.

The official, a male University student, was cited for noise disturbance in lieu of custody, meaning he was arrested and cited but not jailed.

The officer then walked to Sigma Phi Epsilon, where loud music, although muffled, appeared to be coming from inside. The officer told a male subject, who identified himself as an executive board member of the house, that the music had to be turned down or he would face citation or arrest. The subject agreed to comply and turned down the music.
