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Youth found near EMU with drugs, weapon

Eugene police arrested and later released a 17-year-old Eugene youth after discovering he was in possession of a concealed weapon and less than one ounce of marijuana.

On the 1300 block of University Street at approximately 11:20 p.m. Thursday, officers spotted three suspicious-looking subjects near a bicycle rack outside the EMU.

The officers approached and eventually searched the subjects, finding a weapon and a small bag of marijuana in the backpack of the 17-year-old. The other two subjects were searched, but nothing illegal was found.

Police released the arrested youth to his mother, who was, according to a police report, "boorish and insolent" to the officers and acted as though her son's actions were trivial and that he was being harassed by the officers.

After leaving the scene, she drove the wrong way on 13th Av-

enue from University Street toward Agate Street. An officer from the University's Office of Public Safety, who was assisting at the scene, gave chase and pulled over the woman, who told the officer she was very upset at what had happened that evening.

The officer issued an on-campus citation for unsafe driving.

Student caught with open bottle of beer

A University student was cited and released after a Eugene police officer found him with an open bottle of beer in public.

On Nov. 7 at approximately 7:40 p.m., an officer was on foot patrol near Pioneer Cemetery when he saw the man walking north on University Street. As the officer approached him, the man attempted to hide the bottle by putting it at his side not facing the officer.

When told of the violation for having an open alcohol container in public, the male claimed he did not know it was illegal to do so.

The student was cited in lieu of custody, meaning he was arrested and cited but not jailed.

Police arrest man carrying handgun

Two men from Pocatello, Idaho, were arrested on Nov. 11 following what appeared to be preparation for a robbery, a police report stated.

At approximately 4 p.m., Eugene police received a call about a suspicious-looking man near the intersection of E. 18th Avenue and Agate Street. As police traveled to the scene, another call reported that the same man was seen with a handgun.

Police located the man and the weapon in question and took him into custody. He was charged with unlawful possession of a firearm.

Another male, apparently traveling with the first man, was found to be in possession of less than one ounce of marijuana and was arrested.

This incident is still under investigation.
