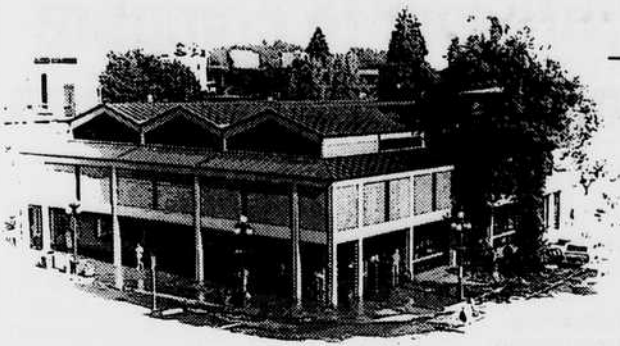




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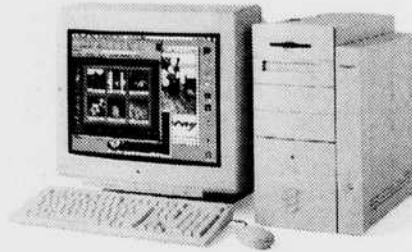

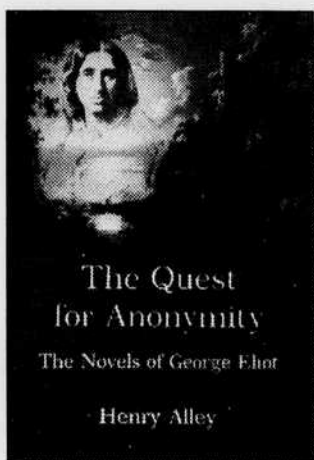

Honors College Professor Henry Alley will read from his latest book, **The Quest for Anonymity: The Novels of George Eliot**. Booksigning to follow. Cosponsored by The Knight Library.

In a new treatment of George Eliot's book-length fiction, Alley argues that from the very moment she adopted a male pseudonym through to the major epic and tragic novels of her later life, the transcendence of fame was her major consideration. Focusing on one novel in each chapter, the study shows how the plights of Eliot's heroines and heroes do not end in frustration but in an affirmation of anonymous achievement.

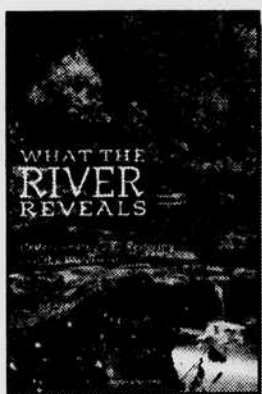

Local author Valerie Rapp will read from and talk about her book **What the River Reveals**. Cosponsored by the Knight Library. A booksigning will follow the event.

What the River Reveals explains modern concepts of river ecology in layman's terms and examines the state of our rivers through conversations with scientists, anglers, and ecologists directly involved with their fate. It covers the important issues—salmon, water quality, stream health and restoration, and overdevelopment. And it describes what can and must be done to save these great natural resources.



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
