Ducks not so Civil to OSU

Oregon's offense was too much for the Beavers to handle as the Ducks won the 101st playing of the Civil war at Autzen Stadium on Saturday

Déjà vu.

For the second straight year, Oregon gave itself a winning season and an opportunity to be invited to a bowl game by stomping Oregon State in the Civil War.

Before 45,735 fans at Autzen Stadium on Saturday afternoon, the Ducks improved their record to 6-5 overall and 3-5 in the Pacific-10 Conference with a 48-30 victory over the Beavers in the 101st playing of this in-state rivalry.

Oregon was in a similar must-win situation last season when it traveled to Corvallis and beat the Beavers 49-13 to run its record to 6-5. Although bowl eligible, Oregon lost out to California for the Aloha Bowl, and Wisconsin was picked instead for the Copper Bowl.

It is the fourth straight year Oregon has had a winning season, the first since 1935, and not coincidentally, it is also the fourth straight win over Oregon State (3-8, 0-8).

Oregon's offense, led by record-breaking performances from two seniors playing in their last game at Autzen, dominated from the get-go, rattling off 444 yards in total offense.

Tailback Saladin McCullough rushed 36 times for 156 yards. That total currently puts him in the lead for the Pac-10 rushing title. To win the conference title, which is based on average yards per game, Arizona running back Trung Canidate needs to rush for no more than 126 yards against Arizona State this Friday.

With his yardage Saturday, McCullough moves into third place on Oregon's single-season rushing record list with 1,193. That's 18 yards off the record held by Bobby Moore (Ahmad Rashad) and nine yards shy of Derek Loville, who is in second place with 1,202.

McCullough also scored one touchdown, ending his career in third place on the school's all-time touchdown list with 26 after playing only 17 games for Oregon. His 19-yard scoring run was one the most amazing runs in his college career, breaking several tackles and reversing the direction two times before lunging into the end zone.

"I think when I watch that one run on film, I'll watch it about 25 times," Oregon head coach Mike Bellotti said of McCullough's tackle-breaking touchdown run. "That is as good a run as you'll ever see."
