5th Street market gets a face-lift

The management plans to renovate, expand and restore the popular downtown market

A popular downtown shopping spot is getting a new look.

The 5th Street Public Market is currently in the process of being renovated, remodeled and expanded. The project is being paid for solely by the market's management and not by the business.

Developer Dan Tucci said planning started about a year ago and renovations began Sept. 1 of last year. Tucci said the planned

completion date is sometime within the first few months of 1999. He said the name of the project is the 5th Street Public Market Renovation and Expansion.

Tucci said a significant amount of work involves remodeling 6,000 square feet of the food court. Included in the project is the construction of five new restaurants, three of which are already under way.

Those three, Tucci said, include Marche Café, a French bistro, Café Glendi, a Greek establishment, and Chelsea Grill, a hamburger and beer joint.

"We'd like to see a Mexican or maybe an Asian restaurant move in," he said.

The parking lot on Sixth Street also will undergo construction. The renovation will include re-grading and resurfacing the lot, as well as adding lighting and landscaping to give the lot a new look, Tucci said.

After that work is completed, Terry's Diner, which faces Sixth Street, will be replaced, most likely in February, by Marche Café. During the spring, the Nike store within the complex will be remodeled and 15,000 feet of retail space will be added.

Other renovations include exterior painting and a new awning. New windows will be placed on the south facade of the market.
