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# Bruin: Martin successful with fade

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UCLA strutted out of McArthur Court with its first win in the building since 1992.

On the afternoon, Martin scored a game-high 27 points on 10 for 17 shooting from the floor and grabbed a game-high 12 rebounds in 33 minutes.

Martin, who has been bothered by a sore back, played just 13 minutes in the first half before going the whole way in the second.

"I thought they did a great job of saving her for the stretch run," Oregon head coach Jody Runge said. "They saved her until they needed her, and she stepped up and scored big for them."

Martin, the 1996-97 Pac-10 freshman of the year, was a major factor in the Bruins turning away a valiant Oregon comeback bid.

She was especially hot just when Oregon was putting the heat on the Bruins, with the Ducks coming all the way back from a 10-point halftime deficit to force a tie at 62 with a little more than eight minutes remaining.

"They came back, and we just kind of looked at the score, and we were still up by six or so, and we never really got flustered," Martin said. "I just wanted the ball. I haven't had a game where I've been really happy with myself in a long time. Today I just wanted to

step up and play hard."

She not only played hard but well, scoring 10 of the Bruins' final 16 points.

First came a rebound hoop to give the Bruins a three-point margin with 6:51 to go.

After a Marie Philman layup gave UCLA a five-point lead, Martin went on a little scoring barrage, netting eight straight Bruin points in a stretch that essentially sealed the win for them.

She nailed a short jumper with 3:20 remaining to bump the lead back to five, 70-65.

After Oregon's Angelina Wolvert cut the deficit to three again, Martin calmly and coolly stretched the lead to five by connecting on both ends of a one-and-one opportunity at the foul line.

A putback of a UCLA miss stretched the lead to six with 2:22 left. Her final points came on a layup with a little more than a minute to play, giving the Bruins a 76-70 lead, and Oregon was all but done for.

"She's playing like a senior," Olivier said. "I think Martin is our leader on the floor. When things got ugly, she wanted the basketball, and that's a big, big thing."

Martin was repeatedly successful fading away from the hoop, a difficult shot to defend but one she hasn't been able to attempt of late because of the back injury.

"She has that little fade going," Olivier said. "I don't know if that's a good thing. She didn't really fade much last year because of her back bothering her a little as she fades. But if she has good looks at the basket, she's gonna put them down."

All of Martin's baskets came on either short jumpers or layups, something which bothered Oregon's Brianne Meharry, one of the Ducks who took a turn at trying to stop Martin on Saturday.

"She is a good player, and we just didn't put a body on her like we needed to," Meharry said. "A lot of her shots were just little shots because we weren't taking care of our business."

Martin sure took care of hers.
