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Women compete in Pac-10 Indoor

The men swept Hawaii-Hilo 7-0 in their first match of the year in Hawaii

In a final individual tuneup before heading into conference play, the Oregon women's tennis team plays at the Pacific-10 Conference Indoor Championships this weekend in Seattle.

First-round play begins Saturday, and the tournament culminates Monday with the championship matches.

Oregon's Alina Wygonowska, Alison Sosnow, Andrea Petrovic, Shanelle Kaneshiro, Sarah Colistro and Jaime Martin will all play in both singles and doubles play.

Oregon's doubles teams consist of Kaneshiro-Sosnow, the No. 9 doubles team in the Northwest, Wygonowska-Petrovic and Kaneshiro-Martin.

The Ducks have three singles

players currently ranked among the top 30 in the region. Those rankings, which are updated periodically, determine who qualifies for the NCAA Individual Championships in May. Wygonowska is ranked No. 12, Petrovic No. 18, and Sosnow No. 22.

Oregon is ranked No. 70 in the country by the latest NCAA poll. Team and Pac-10 play starts on Jan. 30 against Stanford in Eugene. The Ducks also battle California at home on Feb. 1.

While the women are starting their tournament Saturday, the Oregon men were in their second day of competition in Hawaii Thursday.

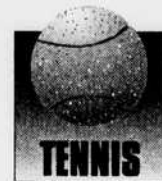
By sweeping Hawaii-Hilo 7-0 in the first round in Hawaii, the men's team got off to an impressive start to its team schedule. The Ducks won all six singles matches and two out of three

doubles matches.

Guillermo Carter, Carlos Navarro, Joaquin Hamdan, Miguel Arriaga, Jeff Thomsen and David Becker all won their singles match for the Ducks. Becker was the only player who needed three sets to win his match. The six singles wins gave the Ducks six points.

The doubles teams of Thomsen-Arriaga and Hamdan-Navarro provided the Ducks with two more wins. Carter and Cedric Van Haver were the only Oregon players to lose in the doubles match, with a 9-8 loss. However, doubles account for only one point in the accumulation of team points. The Ducks completed their sweep thanks to their 2-1 advantage in doubles play.

Erwan Kergroach, the Ducks' highest-ranked player, did not compete in Oregon's victory. Kergroach played No. 1 singles in the Ducks' second match against BYU-Hawaii on Thursday evening. Results of that match were not available at press time.



Martin struggling in South Florida Classic

Casey Martin shot a six-over par in the first round after winning his last tournament

POMPANO BEACH, Fla. — Although Casey Martin was back in his cart, his golf game went for a bumpy ride Thursday in the Nike South Florida Classic.

Martin, waging a court battle with the PGA Tour to be allowed to use a cart, shot a six-over par 76 that left him 12 strokes behind leader Scott Dunlap after the opening round.

It was a far cry from last week, when Martin, 25, won the Nike Lakeland Classic, collecting \$40,500

and bringing worldwide attention to the disability that often makes it too painful for him to walk the course.

Martin suffers from Klippel Trenaunay Weber Syndrome, an incurable circulatory disorder that has weakened his right leg.

He sued the PGA Tour, which does not allow golfers to use carts, under the Americans With Disabilities Act, and was granted an injunction allowing him to ride during the first two Nike events.

Two more Nike Tour victories will qualify him for the PGA Tour.

While he won his first Nike tournament, he will have a hard time prevailing this week at the Palm-Aire Country Club.



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
