Oregon Coast (CRN 27154) — Jan. 30/31, Feb. 1

Investigate the exciting riparian environments of Oregon's rivers. Field labs on local rivers offer firsthand exposure to help students gain an understanding of the problems, relationships, and opportunities for river activities.

3 suspects plead guilty to murder

Three murder suspects entered guilty pleas Friday in front of Judge Mattison.

A total of four suspects are believed to be responsible for the murder of Stephen Leroy Johnson, 21, on Aug. 31, 1997. Johnson's body was found along the Willamette River near the Autzen Foot Bridge last Labor Day weekend.

Lawrence Anthony Hamilton, 22, pled guilty to intentional murder and was sentenced to 300 months. Elizabeth Amber Wilkie, 16, and Caleb Quinn Houser, 17, pled guilty to second-degree manslaughter and were sentenced to 75 months.

Patrick Ryan Roehr, 22, entered a guilty plea to intentional murder in front of Judge Mattison on Jan. 13, 1998. Sentencing for Roehr has not been set.

Hexane spill at lab causes evacuation

A hazardous material spill resulted in the evacuation of 150 to 200 people in downtown Eugene Monday afternoon.

The spill occurred at approximately 2:30 p.m. at Oregon Medical Laboratories, located at 722 E. 11th St., and was contained within the building. No injuries were reported.

According to Teresa Johnson, a safety and regulations officer at the lab, a medical technologist knocked over a one-gallon glass container of a hexane product. The container, which was sitting on the floor, shattered.
