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Ducks face unbeaten Sun Devils

Oregon has lost 11 matches to ASU and have never beaten the Sun Devils on the road

Although the Pacific-10 Conference Championships are still four weeks away, the Oregon wrestling team should know this weekend whether it will come in as a favorite or a long-shot.

Oregon faces defending Pac-10 champion and No. 6 Arizona State in Tempe on Friday and Boise State in Boise on Saturday.

At stake for the No. 20 Ducks against Arizona State: securing a winning Pac-10 record for the second straight season, a fourth victory over a top-10 opponent this season, and a leg up in the race for the conference title.

Easier said than done.

Oregon has lost 11 straight to the Sun Devils and has never beaten them on the road. The last Oregon team to beat Arizona State was the Ron Finley-coached 1974 team that went 16-2-1 overall and

took first place in the Pac-8 conference. That season, the Ducks finished 12th at the NCAA Championships.

A goal that is not out of the reach of Oregon this season.

"We're just starting to get back into sync," said 150-pound Daryl Christian. "This is the best team

I've ever been on. I really think that we have a good chance to beat Arizona State and take the conference title. That's been our goal all season, and we haven't lost it."

The Sun Devils (9-5 overall, 4-0 in Pac-10) are undefeated in the Pac-10 for good reasons. They have seven wrestlers ranked in the top four in their respective weight classes and eight wrestlers ranked in the nation's top-20 in their respective weight class.

"Arizona State is a real solid team," Finley said. "This road trip could present some problems for us. It's never easy to play tough conference opponents on back-to-

back days."

The Ducks' most important matches will likely come in the lower weights where Oregon looks to have a decided advantage. John Taylor (118 pounds) and Jeremy Ensrud (134 pounds) each lead the conference in their respective weight classes, while David Perkins has earned a 12-7 record this season and currently ranks second in the Pac-10 at 126 pounds.

Arizona State is Oregon's second of three road matches in three days. The Ducks play their final match outside the state on Saturday before the Pac-10 and NCAA Championships next month.

The Ducks hold an 11-4-1 series record against Boise State and have not lost to the Broncos since 1992. But the Broncos (4-4-1, 1-1) could present problems for Oregon at 142 pounds, where David Levitt ranks fourth in the Pac-10.

"This is a very crucial road trip for this team," Finley said. "These are teams we need to be able to compete well against if we want to be successful at the Pac-10s."

Wrestlers squeeze past Brigham Young

Chael Sonnen recorded his team-high 11th pin of the season and his third in as many matches to lead the Oregon wrestling team to a 21-17 victory over non conference foe Brigham Young in Provo, Utha, Thursday night.

The No. 20 Ducks won their 11th straight match against the Cougars despite dropping the first two matches at 118 and 126 pounds, and

losing five of 10 matches overall.

Oregon stole back the momentum following Jeremy Ensrud's pin of Tom Mecham just two minutes, 12 seconds into the first period of the 134-pound match. The Oregon middle weights followed suit by winning three of the next four matches.

Daryl Christian defeated BYU's 150-pound Gary Sanderson 6-2. Sean Morgan followed with a 7-0 win over Brett Gappmayer at 158 pounds and Kevin Keeney earned his 18th win of

the season with an 11-5 victory over 167-pound Jeremy Lott.

Sonnen improved to 21-7 this season with his pin of Jason Johnson just 23 seconds into the 190-pound match. The pin moves the sophomore into sixth place on the Duck all-time career falls list and sealed Oregon's slim victory over the Cougars.

The win moved the Ducks to a 7-2 overall record this season and was the team's third straight victory.



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
