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Wrestlers take on Southern Oregon

Oregon has won six of its last seven matches against the Raiders

With its season finale against rival Oregon State only a week away, and the announcement on Monday that head coach Ron Finley will retire at the end of the season, it would be easy for the Oregon wrestling team to overlook its nonconference match with Southern Oregon on Saturday.

But it's not likely, Finley said.

The No. 19 Ducks (7-3-1 overall, 4-2-1 Pacific-10 Conference) enter their final road match of the season with confidence and history on their side.

"We're confident, but we know

not to overlook this team," heavy-weight Rich Polkinghorn said. "They always give us a tough match in their gym. They always have a real rowdy crowd down there, and it can make it tough."



tween the two schools dating back to 1990.

"They are all important matches at this point in the season," said 177-pound Doug Lee. "But this match is always something special. They usually have a real big crowd and are at their best when we show up."

For Lee, as well as 150-pound

Daryl Christian, the trip south will be a homecoming of sorts. Lee, a native of Central Point, has an 11-7 record this season with five major decisions. Christian, who ranks second on the Ducks with 24 victories, hails from Grants Pass.

The Ducks' recent success against Southern Oregon is a sign of an Oregon program that has been improving steadily since 1990. The Raiders have had success at the NAIA level for nearly 20 years.

Southern Oregon, despite the loss of six NAIA All-Americans and six starters, returns a pair of All-Americans this season in junior Matt Paulson and senior Tyson Escobar. Paulson is a two-time NAIA national champion at 134 pounds.

ford, Arizona, UCLA and Washington. So if we can get the win against UCLA, it makes going on the road at Arizona and playing Stanford a little less pressure."

The Ducks and Bruins are two of the hottest teams in the conference right now. Oregon has won five games in a row and six of its last seven. UCLA has won three in a row and seven of its last eight.

Oregon hasn't lost since the game against the Bruins, when the Ducks shot 45.5 percent from the free-throw line.

The game will also be a good test of how the Ducks will fare against the upper-echelon teams without Brianne Meharry, who tore her ACL on Jan. 24 and is out for the season. The Ducks took care of Oregon State (6-12, 1-8) 80-57 last Thursday in their first full game without Meharry.

A key matchup Friday could come inside, where Oregon's Sonja Curtis and Angelina Wolvert, the Ducks' only remaining true post players, will have their hands full with the Bruins' massive 6-foot-4 center Janae Hubbard.

With the Ducks' lack of depth in the post, Wolvert and Curtis need to avoid getting in foul trouble, but if they're not aggressive with Hubbard, she could put up some big numbers, Wolvert said.

"You always want to play as aggressive as you possibly can without fouling," Wolvert said. "It's going to be even more noticeable now that we're playing against someone that's even bigger. She's like twice the size of any of our posts."

Hubbard scored 12 points and grabbed eight rebounds in the first game against Oregon. The Bruins were led in that one by forward Maylana Martin's 27 points. Martin averages 19.5 points a game.

Oregon concludes the road trip by taking on Southern California (8-10, 3-6) on Sunday afternoon. The Ducks beat the Trojans 79-65 on Jan. 8 in Eugene.

USC has lost four of its six games since the first matchup with the Ducks, although it has won two of the past four.

The Ducks trail the all-time series with the Trojans 21-7 and are just 1-13 in Los Angeles. Oregon won its first road game in the series in 1996.

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
