cludes a token experimental song: "Push Me, Pull Me." Vedder speaks in his baritone voice over Beck-esque bass lines, a factory whistle and Beach Boys style back-up vocals. "I'm like an opening band for the sun," concludes the song, finalizing its unearthly feel. "Brain of J." is the album's equivalent to "Spin the Black Circle" off "Vitalogy," and "MFC" sounds like the third part in a series that began with "Vs." "Rearviewmirror" and "Vitalogy's" "Corduroy."

Over the years, Pearl Jam has shown their pleasure in poking fun at different personality quirks, and the songs on "Yield" are no exception. Stone Gossard's "No Way" is a sarcastic lash at apathy. "I've stopped trying to make a difference ... I'm not trying to make a difference, no way," strains Vedder in a way that is almost believable, except for the biting, sardonic tinge behind his voice. And "Do the Evolution" is a brilliant song that makes fun of one of Pearl Jam's favorite targets — humans. "I'm ahead ... I'm advanced ... I'm

the first mammal to make plans," Vedder scratches in a demonic, machismo-filled growl. Backing Vedder's cynical vocals are chunky, grungy guitars that would make fellow Seattlites Mudhoney proud.

The recent release by Pearl Jam is a welcome landing into well-developed and refined musical territory.

Still, that territory is new ground for the band, who had obvious fun with the album, enjoying the exploration of a new musical sound.
