

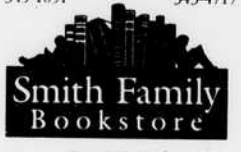
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Notes: Redd whines about officiating

Want some cheese with that whine?

True to form, the Washington Huskies acted just like the Washington Huskies usually do in postgame interviews Saturday.

Last season, it was fans' spit that had allegedly been hurled at head coach June Daugherty that she couldn't stop talking about after her team's 67-60 loss to Oregon at Mac Court.

Redd, one of the conference's top players last season, was near tears complaining about the rowdy crowd.

This season, it seemed like a replay in the Huskies' interview session.

Anything and everything was fair game to blame for their loss.

For Redd, it was Lisa Bowyer's act as a "drama queen" that forced her into shooting her team right out of the game, not

her poor choice of shots or her nine missed three-pointers.

And officiating, well, don't get Redd started. She could talk all night about it, and practically did, about how they didn't have a call go their way in the second half.

Of course, it was the officials who stopped her from scoring even a point in the second half.

In truth, it was Bowyer who was Redd's problem. She can call the Oregon guard whatever she would like, but Bowyer knows she owns Redd.

Redd wasn't the only one whining about Oregon's defensive tactics.

"I don't know what to do other than work on flopping in practice," Daugherty told The Daily of the University of Washington. "It seemed every time we moved in the post somebody fell down and it was an offensive foul."

It was chapter No. 2 in the Huskies' book of whine sessions about Oregon this season.

During the Huskies' 17-point loss to Oregon in Seattle on Jan. 15, Redd more or less conceded the win in the final minutes. She let the ball bounce away from her, then watched it roll out of bounds. After the game, she blamed the incident on the officials, saying the ball was "obviously kicked." Daugherty pulled Redd out of the game and didn't start her star player in the next two games.

Is it too much to ask a 20-year old not to throw temper tantrums like a 5-year old?

Apparently, it is.
