Student uses false address to buy keg

A 22-year-old University student was arrested for providing false information on an Oregon Liquor Control Commission keg receipt Feb. 20, a police report stated.

A Eugene Police Department officer was checking receipts from regular keg distributors, a normal function by EPD officers. The officer found one receipt listed with the consumption location address of 715 E. 24th Ave., which the officer determined to be an invalid address.

The officer then contacted the man who purchased the two kegs listed on the receipt and asked the man the location of the party without identifying himself. After learning of the location, the officer gave his identity and requested the location of the kegs.

According to the report, the man was evasive and would only say the kegs were at an unknown location on Hilyard Street.

The officer then went to the man's residence, located at 930 E. 24th Ave., where the man said he believed the address listed on the receipt was that of his girlfriend's apartment, the party's location. A woman, claiming to be the man's girlfriend, was present and told officers her address was 725 E. 14th Ave.

The man was unable to explain to the officer why he didn't know the street address or apartment number of his girlfriend's residence. He told police he took the kegs to 2288 Hilyard St. and not to his girlfriend's apartment.

The kegs were seized without incident, taken to City Hall and then returned to the distributor who sold the kegs. The officers decided, based on their evidence, that the man knowingly wrote an incorrect and incomplete address on the keg receipt.

The man was instructed to appear in district court on March 6 at 8:30 a.m.

Suspects steal laptop from University Inn

A 19-year-old University student and resident of the University Inn reported a laptop computer stolen after loaning it to a fellow resident Feb. 19, a police report stated.

The man told police he gave the computer to another resident who borrowed it to write a paper. The borrower of the computer said he gave it to a third person to use. The third person claimed he last saw the computer about 9:30 p.m. that evening when he and three suspects were eating pizza.

The third person said two of the suspects took leftover pizza to their vehicle and soon returned. Five minutes later, all three of the suspects left the University Inn, which was when he first noticed the computer was missing.

The third person said he sees the three suspects about once a week visiting with several female residents at the University Inn.

Two brothers report attack on Alder Street

Two University students, who are also brothers, were allegedly attacked Feb. 22 while returning from a fraternity function, a police report stated.

One of the men told police the two were walking south on Alder Street's east sidewalk while on their way to a parking lot at the University. He said that a group of four men began making disparaging remarks from the opposite side of the street.

One of the two brothers then yelled back at the men, asking if they were talking about them.

The group of four men then crossed the street and a verbal argument ensued. One of the men in the group grabbed an umbrella from one of the brothers, breaking it in half.

The two sides then began shoving back and forth. The man owning the broken umbrella asked the man who broke it to pay for the

damages. One or two of the men in the group pulled out their wallets and threw some small change in his direction, according to the report.

As the two brothers walked away, the man who broke the umbrella came at one of the brothers from an angle and struck him in the face, knocking him backwards onto a lawn. The suspects then walked away from the area heading south, the report stated.

According to the report, the two brothers are also members of the Delta Sigma Phi fraternity.

Purse, backpack stolen from Allen Hall

The backpack and purse of a University employee were reported stolen from Allen Hall Monday afternoon, said Agent Rob Olsen of the Eugene Police Department's campus team. The items were reported stolen by the victim, who is the graduate secretary for the University's School of Journalism and Communication, which is located in Allen Hall.

Petra Hagen said she believes the backpack and purse were stolen from beneath her desk in Room 210 between 1 and 2 p.m. on Monday. She added that the purse and backpack held belongings such as credit cards, a checkbook, an address book and sunglasses.

She said she believed whoever was responsible for the theft was "savvy" and knew where to locate her belongings. However, she said that she was approached later in the day at her home address by two individuals with belongings containing her name and address. She added that the individuals said they were transients and claimed they located the items in a dumpster.

Agent Olsen was unable to verify rumors that other items had been stolen from Allen Hall on Monday. Signs were posted throughout the building on Tuesday to warn occupants and students to protect their belongings.
