OPS recently signed a contract formalizing an agreement with the EPD for on-campus patrolling by sworn officers.

The two organizations have been working together without a formal contract for over 20 years. The contract is not expected to change the relationship and will only define how tasks will be

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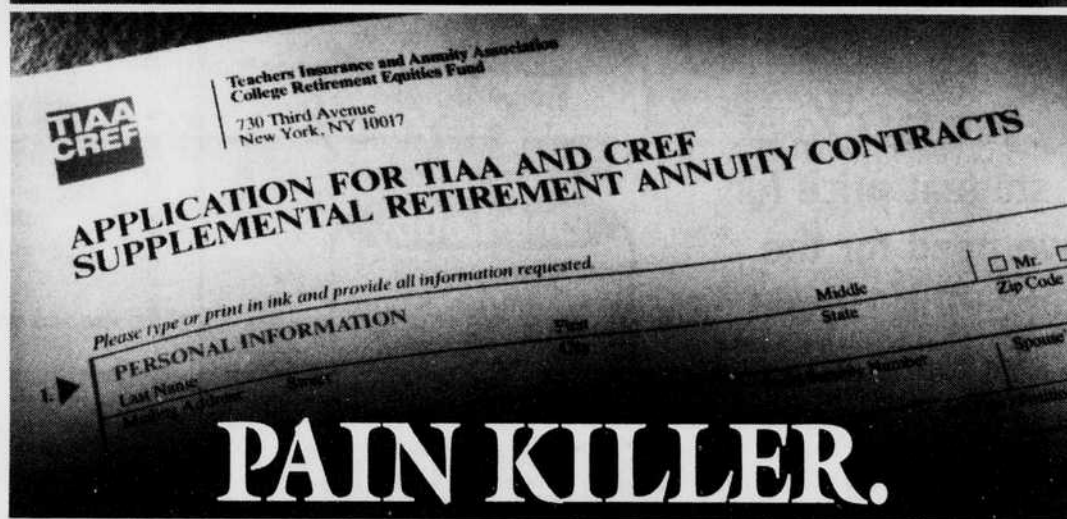
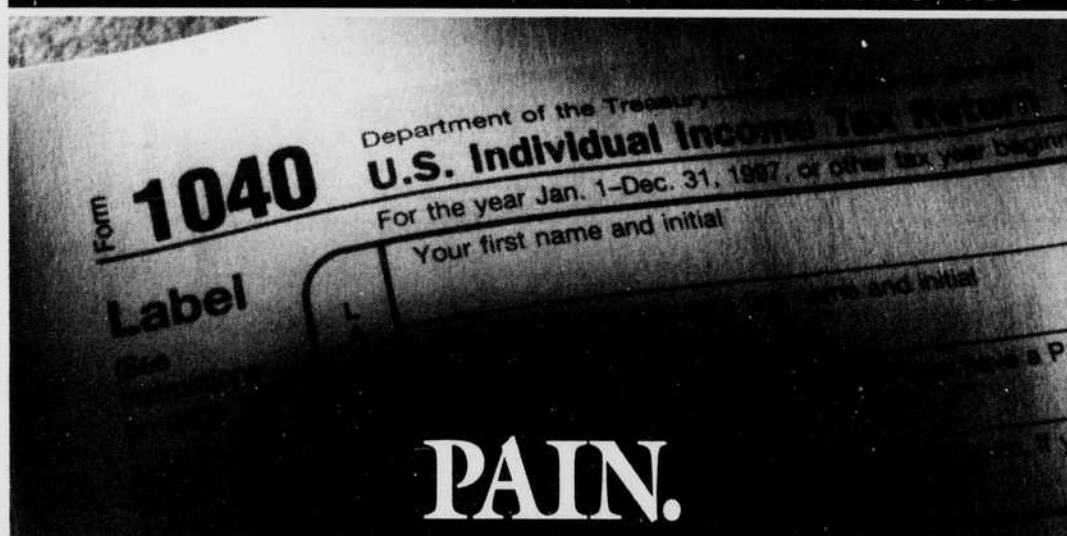
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
