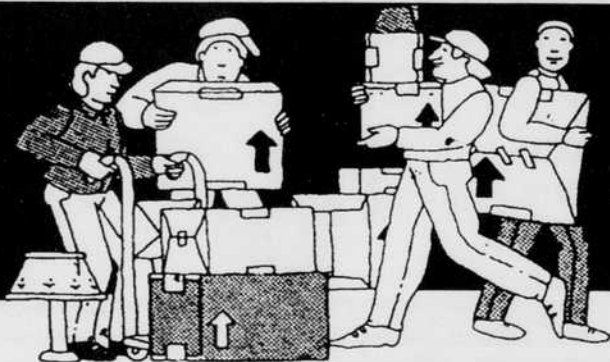

Business school honors leaders

Software giants Paul Allen and Paul Brainerd and businessman Charles H. Lundquist will be honored by the University's Charles H. Lundquist College of Business during its Visionaries Awards Luncheon on Thursday in Portland. The awards are given to individ-

uals who have changed the way business is taught and conducted by challenging concepts of business practices and social responsibility, according to a press release.

Allen, who co-founded Microsoft Corp. with Bill Gates in 1975, will receive the Visionaries Trendsetter of the Year Award.

Brainerd will receive the Visionaries Alumni Trailblazer Award.

He founded Aldus Corp.

Lundquist, chairman of the board of directors of Continental Development Corp. in Los Angeles, will receive the Visionaries Lifetime Achievement Award. Lundquist also endows two scholarship funds as well in the business college's center for entrepreneurship. In 1993, he donated \$10 million to the college.
