### Frohnmayr creates steering committee

University President Dave Frohnmayr established a steering committee last week to review issues related to the Riverfront Research Park and to make recommendations about future project plans.

In a letter notifying committee members of their appointment, Frohnmayr asked for the review of a variety of issues, including land use, the continuing desirability of a public-private partnership, the economic viability of research parks in general and this one specifically, and the proper administrative configuration to achieve dynamic executive leadership for the project.

The committee will work in two subgroups, according to a press release. The first will focus on design and land-use issues, and the second will deal with governmental issues. The subgroups will be headed by Theodore Palmer and Joanne Hugi, respectively.

The steering committee will coordinate its work with an outside consultant. The consultant will examine the master plan for the Riverfront Research Park, evaluate the goals of the plan and suggest improvements. The consultant will also be asked to provide a current national perspective on university-affiliated research parks.

### Wanted man arrested after car chase

Eugene police arrested a 25-year-old man wanted on a warrant following a March 28 car chase that ended after the man turned onto a dead-end road.

Police said Elmer Bigelow Cozad Jr. was taken into custody after eluding police following a traffic stop near West Sixth Avenue and Blair Boulevard for a minor violation.

The subject fled in his vehicle, with officers pursuing for a short time before twice losing sight of the vehicle because of the reckless nature of the subject's driving. Officers spotted the vehicle near East 13th Avenue and Willamette Street.

They followed the vehicle over the Ferry Street Bridge, onto Country Club Road and into the Cal Young area. The driver turned onto Piper Street, a dead end, and was taken into custody without incident.

Cozad was lodged at the Lane County Jail on four counts of eluding, four counts of reckless driving, driving with a revoked license, and on an outstanding warrant for driving under the influence of intoxicants.

### Fire at Alder Street apartment complex

One person was treated for smoke inhalation following a fire at a multi-unit apartment complex March 28, a police report stated.

The Eugene Fire Department responded to and quickly extinguished an apartment fire at 1544 Alder St. Fire and police personnel checked all other apartments in the complex.

The majority of the complex was vacant because of spring break at the University. The damage estimate was unknown at the time of the report.
