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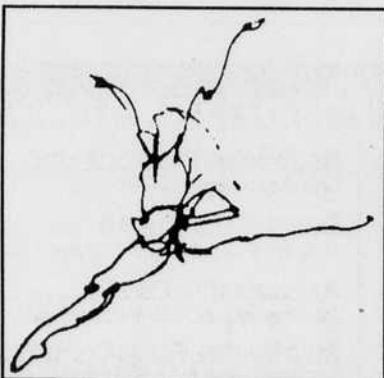
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Safety: Riders should call ahead

"If you need a ride, call in advance," she said. "Ninety-nine percent of the time you'll get a ride, especially if you call early."

She suggests calling in the morning and leaving a message or calling around 5 p.m., when the office opens. Saferide operates from 7 p.m. to 12 a.m. Sunday through Thursday and 7 p.m. to 2 a.m. Friday and Saturday. "You need to realize we can only take a certain amount of women and provide for their safety," Osika said.

Safety around the campus area is especially important when students have been drinking.

DDS offers rides for those students who have been celebrating at a bar or party and can no longer drive.

John Klassen called for a ride from Doc's Pad on his birthday.

"It took them an hour, but I was glad they came to pick us up," he said.

The wait for a ride can range from 10 minutes early in the evening to 30 to 40 minutes later, said public relations director Brandon Smith. They operate 10 p.m. to 3 a.m. Wednesday through Saturday, Smith said. Friday night seems to be the busiest.

"We like to think of ourselves as the T-birds, and they're [Saferide] the pink ladies," Smith said, explaining their partnership in finding rides for students around the campus area. DDS averages 65 to 70 riders per night and takes calls continually until its shut-off time at 3 a.m.

"We don't ever tell people we can't pick them up," Smith said.

Smith suggests prospective riders call 30 to 45 minutes in advance.

"It fluctuates, but it doesn't go in any sort of pattern," said Laurel Rapport, a DDS employee.

DDS plans to request funding on the ballot for a third van during spring elections. Smith said the program could operate seven days a week because of its popularity among students.

On Sunday nights, DDS gets almost the same number of calls as on Wednesdays, even though it doesn't operate, Smith said.

DDS will turn riders away if it thinks they are using the shuttle for transportation to a party. Someone usually tries to abuse the service every night. "People fool us," Smith said. "It happens."

Sanctions: ASUO will support proposal

The constitution, though, provides the court with only one option: removal from office. The court decided Miner's nonfulfillment of one duty did not warrant such a dramatic sanction.

"Our student government failed to act, failed to enforce its own rules," Austin said. "A lot of people lost their faith in student government, lost faith that the system works."

Austin appealed the decision to University President Dave Frohnmayer, who delegated the appeal to Dave Hubin, executive assistant president. Hubin denied the appeal in a two-sentence letter dated March 19.

"The sanction would've been an inappropriate action," he

said Monday. "We didn't feel that this appeal had a role for us."

Austin also filed two grievances with the Senate against Miner, both asking the Senate to withhold Miner's stipend. But Student Senator Jenna Wasson said she didn't think the Senate has that power over the ASUO Executive.

The proposed measure would eliminate that problem by allowing student government to pursue other sanctions, including withholding stipends.

The ASUO plans to support the proposal, Miner said. But student government needs to recognize the impact that sanctions could have on the ASUO's ability to function, he said. Withholding stipends, for example, could

force the president to seek other work and devote less time to leading.

"So, what, do you have public beatings?" he said. "I still don't think failing to do one thing warrants any action at all. But I think, yes, there should be some rule."

Wasson said she had considered filing a motion for nonfulfillment of duties, which could lead to impeachment hearings in the Senate. She decided to support the ballot measure instead.

"There has to be a way we can keep them in check without removing them," she said. "We can address the problem for the future. This is the only way we have to fine tune our constitution."

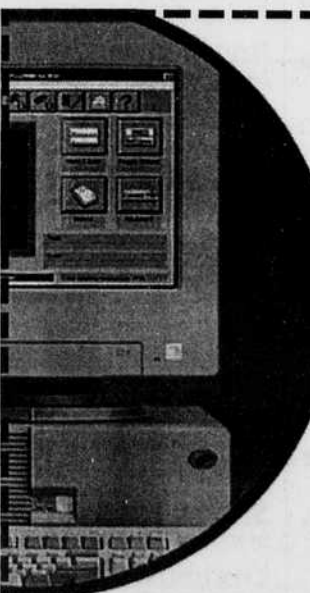

Hot line available to taxpayers

The Oregon Department of Revenue is extending its telephone service hours for tax assistance beginning April 1. Tax representatives will be available for questions from 7 a.m. to 7 p.m. Monday through Friday. The extended hours will last until April 15. The statewide, toll-free number for tax assistance is 1-800-356-4222; the local number is (503) 378-4988.

In addition to one-on-one help, taxpayers can

receive tax assistance through the department's recorded voice response system 24 hours a day. The automated voice response system allows taxpayers to find out when their tax refunds will arrive. In addition to the regular line, the department has special messages for Spanish and hearing and speech impaired taxpayers. The line for Spanish speakers is (503) 945-8618, which is not a toll-free line. The toll-free number for hearing and speech impaired taxpayers is 1-800-886-7204.



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
