The Arizona schools spoiled the Oregon men's team's homecoming with two conference wins

Home-court advantage in consecutive matches for the first time this season could not keep the Oregon men's tennis team from dropping two Pacific-10 Conference dual matches over the weekend.

In only their second and third home dual matches of the season, the Ducks lost to No. 25 Arizona State 7-0 on Friday and No. 41 Arizona 5-2 on Sunday. The losses left Oregon winless in the Pac-10 at 0-4 and with an overall record of 11-9.

However, Oregon head coach Chris Russell could find some solace in the fact that many of the individual losses were of the close, three-set variety.

"You can't play teams much closer and lose," Russell said. "The number of three-set losses that we had this weekend is the difference, and hopefully the guys will be bummed out enough about it to fix it."

The Ducks lost eight of their 12 combined singles matches for the weekend in three sets.

Sunday's match began at the 15th Street Courts, but rain forced a move to the Eugene Swim & Tennis Club half-way through the singles matches.

In doubles, which were played first, the Ducks dropped the single team point by losing two of three matches to the Wildcats.

Oregon's No. 1 doubles team of Erwan Kergroach and Guillermo Carter cruised to its sixth straight win with an 8-4 victory against

Arizona's Jerome Oliveri and Michel Stopa.

Kergroach and Carter also claimed the only two team points for the Ducks by winning their respective singles matches at No. 1 and No. 2 singles.

Kergroach, ranked No. 87 with a 19-6 record, bounced back from a three-set loss to the Sun Devils' No. 50 Gustavo Marcaccio on Friday with a come-from-behind, three-set victory over the Wildcats' Roland Kupka in No. 1 singles.

Women's Tennis

Alina Wygonowska did all she could with two wins in No. 1 singles, but the Oregon women's tennis team still lost two Pac-10 dual matches last weekend in Washington.

The Ducks (3-14, 0-6 Pac-10) extended their losing streak to nine matches with a 5-4 loss at Washington State on Friday and a 5-2 loss at Washington on Sunday.

Women golfers claim fifth in the desert

Something about fifth place has got a hold of the Oregon women's golf team.

At the Ping/Arizona State Invitational last weekend, the Ducks finished fifth for their second consecutive tournament with a team score of 900, which was 28 strokes off Stanford's championship-winning total.

Karen Bristow led the way for Oregon by finishing tied for tenth place with a three-round score of 222, including an even-par 72 in Sunday's final round.

The 16-team tournament featured nine top-25 teams, including No. 10 Oregon, and all 10 of the Pa-

cific-10 Conference teams the Ducks will be battling at the Pac-10 Championships April 20-22.

The No. 8 Cardinal surprised top-ranked Arizona State on its home course by winning the team title by six strokes with a team score of 872. Unranked San Jose State finished second with an 878 score, No. 3 Arizona claimed third with 888, and the Sun Devils completed play eight strokes ahead of the Ducks with an 892 total that was good for fourth place.

Kellee Booth of Arizona State and Stanford's Hilary Homeyer tied for the individual title by shooting combined scores of 215.

Oregon's Kylie Wilson tied for 18th place with a 225 total after shooting an even-par 72 in the final round.

Oregon will look to break its fifth-place association at the Stanford Intercollegiate next weekend.
