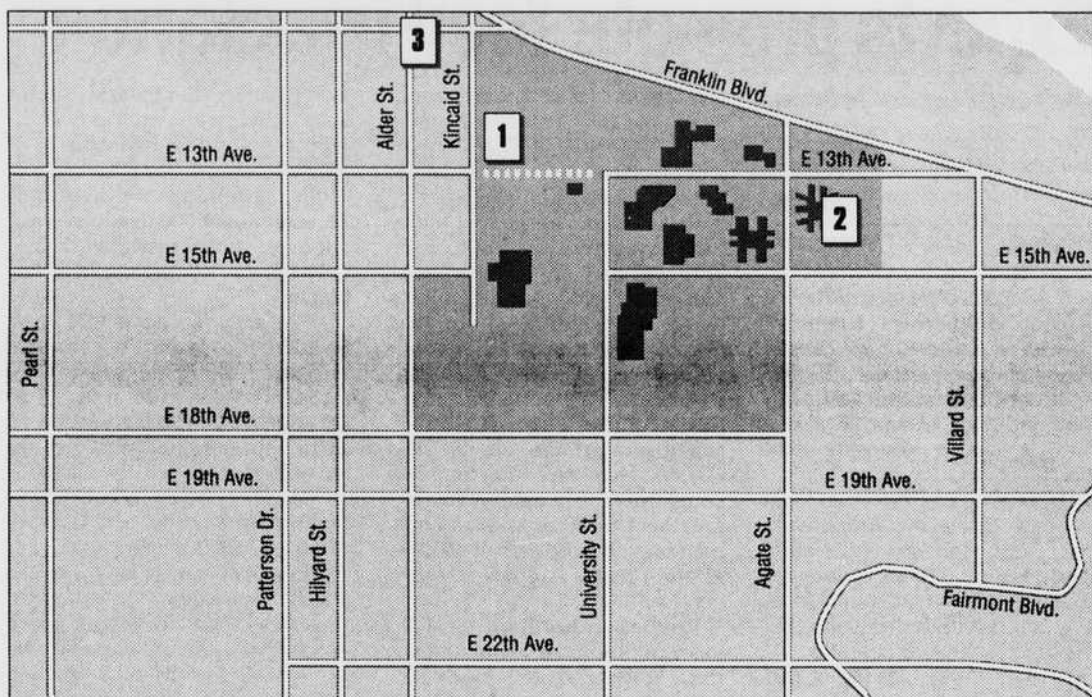

Skateboarder charged with criminal mischief

1 A 20-year-old University student was arrested and charged with criminal mischief after riding his skateboard in a prohibited area on campus April 4, according to a police report.

An officer with the University Office of Public Safety observed the man performing "stunts" on his skateboard in a breezeway between the Chiles Business Center and the Computing Center on East 13th Avenue.

The man was jumping onto the side of a concrete planter adjacent to the Chiles Business Center. The University has strict rules against the use of skateboards on University property.

A Eugene police officer arrived on the scene and discovered fresh scrape marks on the planter in the same spot the OPS officer saw the man jump his skateboard.

The man said he was jumping his skateboard but did not make the marks on the planter. The skateboard was confiscated, and the man was given a receipt with instructions on how to recover the skateboard.

The man was cited to appear in municipal court on April 17 and then released.

Nine students cited for alcohol violations

2 Nine University students were cited for minor in possession of alcohol after a student patrol officer smelled the strong odor of beer coming from a residence hall room, according to a police report.

The resident of the room was charged with furnishing alcohol to minors and misrepresentation of age after using the driver's license of a friend to purchase beer.

The student officer was passing through the lobby of Spiller Hall in the Hamilton Complex at 1364 Columbia St. when she smelled the odor coming from one of the rooms.

An OPS officer arrived to assist in the investigation. The officer saw through the room's exterior blinds a number of people who all appeared to be under 21 years old drinking from beer bottles, the report stated.

The officers contacted the resident of the room, who admitted to purchasing beer at a Eugene Dari-Mart with the driver's license of a friend, also a University student. The man and his friend are similar in appearance, according to the report.

Two 12-pack containers of beer were found under the resident's bed, and numerous bottles and cans of beer were found in the room.

All of the persons in the room were 18 or 19 years old and admitted to consuming various amounts of alcohol, the report stated.

Kappa Sigma official issued noise violation

3 A 21-year-old fraternity official was issued a noise disturbance violation April 5 following complaints from hotel guests about loud music coming from the area of the fraternity.

Police said the manager of the Phoenix Inn, located at 850

Franklin Blvd., fielded complaints from guests about the noise, which prompted her to call police about the incident.

Three or four houses in the area were having parties at the time, but police decided the noise was coming from the basement of the Kappa Sigma fraternity. The back door of the fraternity opens to the north, in the direction of the Phoenix Inn.

The music was audible and extremely loud one block north of the fraternity, the report stated.

Police contacted a fraternity official, who said they were having a function, complete with security. The official said the party was winding down after police asked him to end it, according to the report.

Approximately one hour later, police returned and told the official he would be issued a citation for noise disturbance, and he agreed to end the party and clear the house of any non-residents.

Officers then instructed the disc jockey working at the party to make an announcement for everyone to leave. The disc jockey and the people at the party complied with the request.

An officer then observed a woman who appeared to be under 21 years of age carrying an open beer container onto the fraternity's porch. The officer contacted the woman, whose only identification was a student body card from Westview High School in Aloha. She then told police she was 19 years old.

She was issued a citation for minor in possession and released.
