

ballot measures

Question 1:

OSPIRG (Oregon Student Public Interest Research Group) is a statewide, student-directed educational organization which since 1971 has involved students in environmental, consumer, voter registration, and hunger and homelessness issues. Do you support the continued existence of a University of Oregon chapter of OSPIRG to be funded from student incidental fees at a rate which reflects approximately \$2.88 per student per term for a total of (\$147,390)?

Question 2:

Shall the United States Student Association funding be maintained at approximately 46 cents per student per term of the incidental fee to generate \$22,750 to fund work on protecting federal financial aid as well as student rights issues?

Question 3:

Currently the ASUO funds the United States Student Association (USSA), a student run higher education and federal financial aid advocacy group, at approximately 46 cents per student per term. Shall the student incidental fee increase approximately 37 cents per student per term to fund USSA at \$40,568 (a total of 83 cents per student per term of USSA) in order to receive an upgrade in current referenda membership services?

Question 4:

(This fee must be allocated as an exact fee per student because Lane Transit District requires payment on this basis.) Student fees currently fund unlimited bus service within the Lane Transit District service means that any currently registered U of O

students. Unlimited bus service means that any currently-registered U of O student may ride the bus anywhere in Lane Transit District's service area as often as desired by showing the bus driver a current U of O identification card valid for the current term or semester. This unlimited bus service also is provided between consecutive terms, meaning that a valid identification card for one term continues to be valid until the first day of the next term/semester. Shall a Student Incidental Fee be established at \$6.87 per student per term to generate approximately \$354,000 to fund unlimited bus service within the Lane Transit District service area for all currently registered U of O students for the 1998-99 fiscal year? Law students would pay \$10.31 per student per regular semester and \$6.87 per student for the summer semester.

Question 5:

Shall student incidental fees be increased for one year only by approximately \$1.06 per student per term to generate \$50,000 per year to fund the Designated Driver Shuttle in such a manner that the Designated Driver Shuttle will provide service seven days a week during the regular school year?

Question 6:

Shall student incidental fees be raised by \$7.35 per term, for one year, to generate \$330,000 to fund the construction of an elevator that would allow wheelchair and ADA accessibility to the International Student Lounge, the Oregon Daily Emerald, and the Adell McMillan Art Gallery?

Question 7:

Shall student incidental fees be increased by approximately \$0.63 per student per term

for one year to generate \$28,485 to fund access to the EMU Computing Center and the lower level on the East side of the EMU to extend the hours of operation to 7 am to 2 am seven days a week?

Question 8:

Shall section 14.4 of the Constitution, which currently reads, "The Student Senate and the EMU Board may, independently of each other and by 2/3 vote of their respective memberships, place on the ballot proposals dealing respective jurisdiction without petition, except that the EMUB may not so place a matter regarding the EMU budget to any portion thereof", be struck out and replaced by, "The Student Senate may by a 2/3 vote of its seated members, place on the ballot proposals, referendums, and amendments without petition."?

Question 9:

Shall the ASUO Constitution be amended to insert a section 14.6 which would read, "Multiple year funding commitments funded with incidental fees shall be authorized only through the initiative and referendum process and approved by direct vote of the student body. Commitments for multiple year incidental fee funding shall not exceed a period of two consecutive years. This rule shall not affect approved ballot measures for multi-year funding previously to, or during, the Spring 1998 election."

Question 10:

Shall student incidental fees be increased by approximately \$0.47 per student per term during the 1998-1999 year to generate \$22,200 to purchase a new 15 passenger van for use by Designated Driver Shuttle?
