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Men hope momentum continues

Oregon begins play in the Thunderbird Invitational in Tempe, Ariz., on Saturday

Momentum is paramount in sports.

Next to wins and championships, it may be the most desired object of coaches and teams.

Going into the Thunderbird Invitational in Tempe, Ariz., the Oregon men's golf team has momentum following its 288 final-round score in the U.S. Intercollegiate at Stanford last Monday.

That team total was the best one-round score of the tournament and allowed the Ducks to rise from 12th to fifth place in the final 18 holes.

The Ducks just hope that stellar play will continue in their final regular-season tournament at Karsten Golf Club.

The first two rounds of the 54-hole tournament will be played

Saturday and the final round Sunday.

The 18-team field includes seven ranked teams, the Swedish National Team and nine Pacific-10 Conference teams.

Ben Crane shot a final-round 68 at Stanford to lead Oregon's comeback and secure a third-place finish for himself that was one stroke



behind co-winners Rich Barcelo of Nevada and Herbert Forster of Pacific.

It was Crane's best placing since tying for first in the Ducks' first tournament of the season, the Pacific Invitational, Sept. 23. Crane's 68 was also his lowest single-round score since shooting a 67 at the Pacific Invitational.

Crane, ranked No. 56 in the MasterCard Collegiate Golf Rankings, leads Oregon with a 72.7 shots-per-round average.

Ryan Lavoie is second on the team in shots per round, averaging

73.1.

Lavoie recovered from a 79 in the second round at Stanford to shoot a final-round 74 and finish tied for 38th. Before that tournament, Lavoie had two straight top-10 finishes at the Oregon Duck Invitational on March 10, when he tied for sixth, and the USC Cleveland Southwestern on March 24, when he tied for eighth.

Chris Cone finished second among the Ducks at Stanford by tying for 25th. That placing marked his highest since tying for sixth at the Fresno Lexus Classic on Oct. 25.

Cone has a 74.4 shots-per-round average.

In his first away tournament with Oregon since the Nevada Wolfpack Classic last October, Derek Croskrey showed he has recovered from a broken arm by tying for 68th at Stanford and shooting a final-round 72.

Oregon begins what it hopes will be a long postseason at the Pac-10 Tournament in Orinda, Calif., on April 27.

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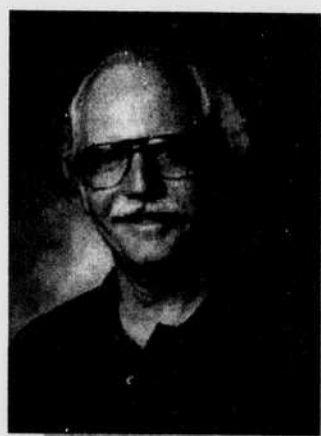
